July 10, 2012 ELIZABETHTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT LOCAL/STATE BOARD FACILITIES HEARING REPORT

A Local/State public hearing was held at Elizabethtown High School on July10, 2012, at 5:30 P.M. (EDT). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Elizabethtown Independent Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted unanimously (12-0) in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 5-0 to approve the new plan.

There were (2) two individuals in attendance. Grover Canty, Facilitator for the Kentucky School Boards Association, served as the district-appointed hearing officer.

COMMENTS

Grover Canty the hearing officer called the public hearing to order and welcomed the hearing officer to the district. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR4:180. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Board of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed new District Facility Plan which includes; Making all current school centers Permanent Facilities with an organizational plan of PS-K, 1-5, 6-8, 9-12. Priority One (1): There are no projects_listed in priority number one; Priority Two (2): Major renovation/additions to Elizabethtown High School, T.K. Stone Middle School, Morningside Elementary School, Valley View Educational Center and District White Board Initiative; Priority Three (3): There are no projects listed in priority number three; Priority Four (4): Construct a new Central Office, Major Renovation Bus Garage/Maintenance Shop, ; Priority five (5): There are several discretionary projects at Elizabethtown High School, T.K. Stone Middle School, Helmwood Heights Elementary School, Morningside Elementary, football press box/Middle School, football toilets/Middle School, football visitor stadium/Middle School and construct an MDF room at Valley View Educational Center.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. No one spoke or submitted a written statement concerning the proposed plan for the Elizabethtown Independent School District.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Elizabethtown Independent Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Elizabethtown Independent Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Elizabethtown Independent School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
