Action/Discussion Item:

702 KAR 7:065, Designation of Agent to Manage Interscholastic Athletics (High School and Middle School) and Revisions in the Kentucky High School Athletics Association Bylaws and Constitution (Second Reading)

Applicable Statute or Regulation:

KRS 156.070 702 KAR 7:065 KHSAA Bylaws and Constitution

History/Background:

Existing Policy. 702 KAR 7:065 (included as attachment "A") designates the Kentucky High School Athletics Association (KHSAA) as the entity to manage interscholastic athletics. Recommended amendments to this regulation are coming forward from two sources: 1) implementation of policy considerations from the Task Force on Middle School Interscholastic Athletics (reviewed by Kentucky Board of Education (KBE) in February 2013) and 2) the annual KHSAA bylaw/constitution update as a result of action by the KHSAA Board of Control and membership votes.

Those proposed changes to the regulation based upon policy considerations of the Task Force on Middle School Interscholastic Athletics are listed below (changes in the actual regulation appear in <u>underline</u> format):

- Per Policy Consideration #2: Designation of the KHSAA as the entity to manage middle school interscholastic athletics. (Section 1, page 1 of the regulation and various additions of "middle" and "high school" throughout regulation to conform)
- Per Policy Consideration #3: Establishment of a permanent work group to advise the KHSAA and the KBE regarding middle school athletics. (Section 3, page 5 of the regulation)
- Per Policy Consideration #4: Requirement that non-profit organizations sanctioned by the KHSAA to conduct middle school athletics provide documentation of financial accountability, Title IX compliance and mandatory training of coaches. (Section 3, pages 5-6 of the regulation)
- Per Policy Consideration #6: Application of existing KHSAA rules for physical examinations, heat index and concussions for middle school athletics. (Section 3, pages 4-5 of the regulation)
- Per Policy Consideration #7: Creation of a framework for development of a limitation on the number of allowable contests for middle school athletics. (Section 3, pages 6-7 of the regulation)
- Per Policy Consideration #10: Adoption of eligibility rules and eligibility prohibition for students below grade 7. (Section 3 (5) and Section 3 generally, pages 4 and 6 of the regulation)
- Per Policy Consideration #11: Establishment of certification and background check requirements for middle school coaches/paraprofessionals. (Section 3, page 4 of the regulation)

The other proposed changes resulting from KHSAA Board of Control action and membership votes impact the Constitution and Bylaws. Each of these changes received the requisite 2/3 vote (included as attachment "B") and were presented to the membership of the Association at its September 18, 2013 annual meeting. Items considered at the annual meeting are submitted both by the KHSAA Board of Control as part of its annual Constitution and Bylaws review and by the member schools, and are reviewed by the Board of Control prior to the development of the final agenda. At the 2012 annual meeting of the member schools, 221 schools were present; therefore, all proposals required 148 affirmative votes for passage. In accordance with the KHSAA Constitution and Policies and Procedures, as well as the requirements of 702 KAR 7:065, any amendment receiving the requisite vote of the membership is to be considered by the Board of Control and a recommendation made to the Kentucky Board of Education for further action.

In accordance with these procedures, the following amendments to the KHSAA Bylaws were approved by the listed votes. These have been considered by the Board of Control (BOC) of the KHSAA for implementation during the 2013-14 school year unless otherwise noted and received the requisite vote of the Board of Control.
