## ELLIOTT COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT DISTRCT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT\*

A public hearing was held at the Elliott County Superintendent's Office on Friday, April 26, 2013, at 6:00 p.m. (local time). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Elliott County School District Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted unanimously in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 5/0 to approve the new plan.

There were 9 individuals in attendance. C. Thomas Potter II, Superintendent of Schools served as the locally-appointed hearing officer. Larry Salyer, Sherry Hale, Sarah Beth Kelly, Madison Dehart, Nancy Kuehner, Wanda Bang, Alan Kuehner, Jenine Adams and Kathy Adkins were present.

#### **COMMENTS**

Larry Salyer, District Representative, called the public hearing to order. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Board of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed new District Facility Plan which includes; Lakeside Elementary site development, bus loading & unloading, roof replacement, windows, ADA accessibility; Elliott County High roof replacement, doors, hardware, windows, interior finishes, lockers, HVC replacement, electrical/lighting/service upgrades, plumbing/fixtures, security upgrades, ADA accessibility; Old Elliott County High School Gym roof replacement, doors, hardware, interior finishes, accessories, lockers, casework, signage, HVAC replacement, electrical upgrades, plumbing, fire protection, annunciation systems, security upgrades, ADA accessibility; Isonville Elementary site development, bus loading & unloading, restroom renovation, electrical, plumbing, security upgrades, ADA accessibility and construct Administrative Addition; Sandy Hook Elementary roof replacement, security upgrades, ADA doors, hardware and system upgrades, & finishes not addressed in 2008 renovation, construction of 4 Special Educ. Resource room and 1 Computer Classroom. New additions: Preschool, SBDM Office & Conf., Family Resource. Provide active boards and projectors in all classrooms district wide with wireless capability for hand-held student assessment and remote operation (20 Interactive Smart Boards). Support Areas: Central Office/Maintenance Facility, conversion of old Natatorium into a Central Office/Maintenance Facility. District Need: Athletic Facility, renovate/construct athletic fields.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. Alan Kuehner, a citizen of Elliott County, made a statement regarding possible ways to slow down or divert water away from Isonville Elementary School during heavy rains and flooding.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Elliott County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Elliott County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Elliott County School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
