On March 5, 1964, ten thousand citizens from all across Kentucky gathered before the State Capitol on a bitterly cold day to demonstrate their support for a statewide public accommodations bill. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and other national speakers including Jackie Robinson and the Reverend Ralph Abernathy addressed those assembled. Folk singers Peter, Paul and Mary performed. The 1964 march, which placed Kentucky in the national spotlight, helped end overt segregation in Kentucky and ultimately led to the passage of the Kentucky Civil Rights Act.

On March 5, 2014, we will once again gather at our state's capital to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of this historic March on Frankfort.

As we address current-day human rights issues in Kentucky, we march in hopes of urging and encouraging our state legislators to pass HB70, voter restoration rights to former felons who have served their sentence and paid their debt to society. In Kentucky, approximately one out of every four African Americans is disenfranchised. This rate is nearly triple the national African American disenfranchisement rate of 8.25 percent. Kentucky has the highest African American disenfranchisement rate in the country. To further this issue, our theme is LIFT EVERY VOICE AND VOTE.

We encourage you to not only support our theme but to bring your own issue signs to the march and let your message be read as we march to the capitol steps for our rally which begins at 10:00a, E.S.T.

There are many gathering points in the state where you can join a motorcade to Frankfort, get on a bus, or carpool. For contact information in your area, call Mary Ann Taylor at the Kentucky Commission on Human Rights at 1-502-782-9728.

The march will begin promptly at 10:00am E.S.T. so marchers need to line-up at Second Street and Capital Avenue by 9:30a.m. E.S.T. Elderly and Disabled will be seated at the capitol steps and may be dropped off at that location. Frankfort and Capitol police will direct all buses, cars, and cycles to appropriate drop off, parking and pick up locations. Buses should plan to arrive at the shopping center parking lot located at 1300 U.S. 127 South (K-Mart). They will be met at this location at 09:30 and escorted into town to the drop off location. If the bus driver or contact person needs information please call 502-682-0556 or 502-682-0431 or 502-682-0775. Any of these three phone numbers will get you information about parking, drop off or pick up locations. Group leaders, march leadership, and media are asked to check in at the "check-in" tent, corner of Second Street and Capital Avenue for line up placement and instructions.

Immediately following the march, marchers are encouraged to visit the Governors' mansion, which is celebrating its 100th year anniversary. The Governor's mansion will also open its new educational wing and all are invited to visit.

On that same day, the Frankfort History Museum and the KY History Society will open its doors with civil rights exhibits highlighting the original March on Frankfort.

We look forward to sharing this most historic event with you. However, should the weather prove too inclement to march, our alternate location will be the Frankfort Convention Center, so stay tuned to local radio, television and social media for updates.

As we go forth with the march, we should keep in mind a thought-provoking quote often shared by Dr. King: "Evil only succeeds when good people do nothing." If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Ms. Taylor using the information above. We look forward to your participation!
