DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN AMENDMENT HEARING REPORT

A public hearing was held at the Christian County Board Office on January 9, 2014, at 5:37 pm. The purpose of the public hearing was to propose an Amendment to the previously approved District Facility Plan developed by the Christian County Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted 13 to 0 in favor of the proposed Amendment and the Board voted 4 to 0 to approve the Amendment.

There were no public participants in attendance for the hearing. Scott Noel, LPC Facilitator, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer. Those present to hear the report was (1) Christian County School Board Members, School Superintendent, Christian County Facilities Director, Chief Operating Officer and several guests for the Local Board Meeting.

COMMENTS

Scott Noel, Board Appointed Hearing Officer called the public hearing to order. The purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures were reviewed indicating they were in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would also be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Department of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed District Facility Plan Amendment which includes;

1. Long Range Plan revised to PS-6, 7-8, 9-12.
2. Christian County Middle and Hopkinsville Middle Schools revised to be Permanent 7-8 Centers.
3. North Drive Middle School revised to become North Drive Elementary, Permanent PS-6 Center.
4. Belmont Elementary School revised to become a Transitional PS-6 Center.
5. Crofton, Indian Hills, Martin Luther King, Millbrook, Sinking Fork and South Christian Elementary Schools were revised to become PS-6 Centers.
6. Sinking Fork Elementary – (4) Classroom Addition.
7. South Christian Elementary – (2) Classroom Addition.
8. North Drive Elementary – Minor renovation for PS/K restroom/storage requirements, and (4) Classroom Addition.
9. The Amended District Need was revised to \$100,508,418.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the District Facility Plan Amendment developed by the Christian County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Christian County Board of Education be approved. A copy of the amended plan is attached for your convenience.
