RE: Financial Aid Report

At your direction, we have reviewed the financial aid reports from the schools for the academic year 2014-2015.

We have divided our report into two sections. Part 1 is the Process Review. We are not satisfied with the current process for review of these reports and are not satisfied with the execution of the review and have the following recommendations for improvement in future years:

- This report has always published a June 30 deadline for submission. We will be more aggressive in enforcing that deadline through a series of steps.
- We are currently reviewing the questions asked of the schools and will attempt to clarify some of the confusion that some schools have expressed on certain questions. We will ask the entire executive staff to review the questions to see if some can be eliminated or consolidated without impacting the integrity of the necessary reporting. We will utilize the experience of other staff members much more familiar with the development of this rule to be sure in our attempt to consolidate and clarify, we do not lose the original intent of the report. In many cases, we may need to be more explanatory about the questions and utilize other means (slides, presentations, etc.) to be sure our member schools understand both the rule and the report.
- We will send a PDF version of the final approved list of questions to the schools on April 1st so that schools may begin to gather the information necessary for this report.
- The electronic report link will be sent to the Schools on April 15th, with a revised requested date for completion of June 1st.
- A reminder email will go to the schools the first week of May.
- After June 1st, the two of us will contact any school showing as not completed, to offer assistance in getting that report finished and clarify any missing issues.
- On June 30th we will create a report to the Commissioner of any school that has not complied and begin compilation
 of the report for the Board for presentation in the summer/fall of 2016. Investigations will be scheduled prior to the
 full reporting.

Part 2 of the report is the actual analysis of the data for 2014-15.

- As of today, there are six schools that have failed to submit the report.
 - Barbourville
 - Bryan Station
 - Greenup County
 - Knox Central
 - Magoffin County
 - Newport

• Based upon the reports received, we have twelve schools that we feel a need to follow up on with an investigation centered on the answers given by those schools (see attached).
