Competitive eSports are a growing phenomenon in our Country. I wanted to point out some intriguing stats and news that the NFHS may want to consider as we think about getting involved in this area of sport:

- Newzoo, a research firm that studies eSports, estimates that the industry brought in revenues of \$493 million globally last year, and predicts that will grow to \$1.1 billion in 2019.
- The University of Utah has become the 1<sup>st</sup> power-five university to offer scholarships to students that play eSports for the University.
  - There are 34 collegiate varsity eSports programs across the country and some officials project as many as 50 to 60 schools will sponsor an eSports team by the next academic year (predominantly NAIA schools).
- The NACE seems to be the current governing body for collegiate eSports. They were founded in September 2016 and are supported by the NAIA. They have a complete constitution and set of bylaws for their members.
  - o 31 of the 34 varsity eSport programs are members of NACE
    - Averaging about \$7,600 per scholarship
  - NACE projects that about \$7 million in annual eSports scholarships will be granted by the next academic year from varsity programs.
- Last year's League of Legends championships attracted more than 43 million unique viewers, topping out at 14.7 million concurrent viewers during its peak. This year's NBA finals, by comparison, are averaging 19.3 million total live viewers on ABC and streaming platforms combined.
- In 2018, 17 NBA franchises, including the Utah Jazz, will participate in an eSports league centred on the NBA 2K gaming franchise.

- The Big Ten Conference has agreed to a partnership with Riot Games (developer of League of Legends) to provide scholarships and a competition for eight of their conference schools.
  - Initially partnering with a video game developer may be way to enter eSport space
- Big East Commissioner Val Ackerman said the schools in her conference are intrigued by the
  connection with students focused on science, technology, engineering and math. Essentially,
  administrators see eSports as another way to recruit students in their hyper-competitive
  landscape.

  - o From John Lasker, vice president of programming and acquisitions at ESPN: "It's been clear to us that it's [eSports] a growing category on the global scale and now, more recently, in the United States. We see that there's a pretty good crossover in terms of audience comparisons and interest in terms of participating in video games and eSports and what you would call traditional sports. We feel like it's a natural thing for ESPN."
- AnyKey (<a href="http://www.anykey.org/">http://www.anykey.org/</a>) is an organization that is leading the effort to ensure a diverse and inclusive environment in eSports.
- eSports will be an official medal sport at the 2022 Asian Games in China
- eSport Fan Demographics (based on survey of 497 eSport fanatics conducted by Mindshare NA):
  - "Forty-three percent of eSports enthusiasts have an annual household income of \$75,000 per year or higher — and nearly one third (31 percent) have an HHI2 of \$90,000 or higher."
  - There is a large proportion of millennials in the demographic. Sixty-five percent of fans are between the ages of 18-34, but 60 percent are between 25 and 39.
  - o Women make up a significant proportion of the fan base, registering 38 percent.
  - o Fifty-eight percent of fans over the age of 25 have children of their own.
