
The school personnel or volunteer attending in an official capacity that is in charge of the student is responsible for the main components of the EAP.

- The main components of this Cardiac Emergency Action Plan that need to be communicated include: • Location of AEDs
  - · If possible, how to gain access
  - Steps that must be taken quickly to initiate the chain of survival
    - Recognition of a sudden cardiac arrest event (assume cardiac arrest in anyone who is collapsed and unresponsive and not breathing)
    - o Call 9-1-1 using cell phone or other means of communication
    - Begin Hands-Only CPR (push hard and fast in center of chest about 100 times/minute)
       Retrieve and use the nearest Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
    - o Retrieve and use the nearest Automated External Denominator (AED)
       o Continuing supporting the victim until the local EMS arrives and takes over care o
    - Direct EMS to the scene attending the event in an official capacity


