



#### Groupings




The majority of REAPs noted that there were no racial or ethnic groups with the greatest level of concern.

Students of color made up the following 3 most common categories. The 'other' category was 5<sup>th</sup> most common and mostly included students with different cultures/religions (49) and those with English as a second language (39).



The most common domain for REAPs is Culture / Climate with more than double the second most common.




Within Progress Monitoring 17 of 22 desired outcomes were used at least once. The most common desired outcome was sense of belonging for students of color

The top 5 desired outcomes are more similar, with majority focused directly on students. 3 of the 5 were focused on academic experiences and the 2 others were focused on Relationships

### Usefulness

Out of 793 REAPs, 588 (74%) responses included a rating of usefulness. Of the 588 responses, 322 (55%) rated the REAP process as either 'pretty helpful' or 'very helpful'. 25 (3%) rated the REAP as 'not helpful'.

If Likert scale scores were averaged, the average usefulness rating of the REAP tool would be 3.61 out of 5.


### Additional Information and Dashboard Link

- Out of 20 REAPs that were selected to not move forward, 16 were related to Culture / Climate
- The range of REAPs completely by each school varied dramatically. Number of responses by school ranged from 52 to 1 with a 6.3 average.
- 5 Progress Monitoring outcomes were not selected by any REAPs these include:
  - Contracts with Minority/Women-owned businesses
  - Students of Color applying to magnet program(s)
  - Students of Color completing higher level courses
  - Students of Color with qualifying score/grade
  - Number of college applications for Students of Color



### Groupings




The vast majority of REAPs noted that there were no racial or ethnic groups with the greatest level of concern.

Second most common was the 'other' category. Within this category the groups with the most concerns were those with English as a second language (24).



The most common domain for REAPs is Curriculum followed by Culture/Climate.




Within Progress Monitoring 19 of 23 desired outcomes were used at least once. The most common desired outcome was sense of belonging for students of color.

The top desired outcomes impacted students more often than teachers. Culturally responsive and relevant learning was desired for both groups.

### Usefulness

Out of 455 REAPs, only 100 (22%) responses included a rating of usefulness. Of the 100 responses, 86 (86%) rated the REAP process as either 'pretty helpful' or 'very helpful'. No one rated the REAP as 'not helpful'.

If Likert scale scores were averaged, the average usefulness rating of the REAP tool would be 4.41 out of 5.

## Additional Information and Dashboard Link

- When looking at most concerned groups, they often were not based on race. Instead, the groups with the greatest concerns were those with English as a second language.
- Most responses do not include the anticipated impact or whether they found the REAPs process helpful.
- 79 responses included Progress Monitoring outcomes, the 4 that were not selected by any REAPs were:
  - Number of courses offered that consider cultural contribution and perspectives.
  - Restraints for Students of Color
  - Students of Color applying to magnet program(s)
  - Students of Color enrolled in magnet program(s)
