Grant Application of Franklin-Simpson Bands & Band Boosters Under the Direction of Kyle Graves Franklin-Simpson Bands encompasses part of the music education offerings at FS Middle and High School, under the direction of Kyle Graves and Amber Lamastus. We currently serve approximately 200 students, making the band program one of the largest student groups in the county! Musicians and performers have the opportunity to perform in a variety of ensembles, such as the Wildcat Marching Band, Middle & High School Concert Bands, Colorguard, Varsity and Junior Varsity Winter Guards, Pep Band, Jazz Band, Percussion Ensembles, and a host of various district, region, and state honor bands.

The mission of Franklin-Simpson Schools, per Superintendent Scholsser is to "develop all students to their fullest potential and prepare them for the next level of life". Music education is a tool with a proven success rate in helping students become well rounded citizens. While in school, music can reiterate and reinforce the teachings of other subjects like math and language arts while expanding less tangible, but equally vital skills, like tenacity, expression, and teamwork. After graduation, the skill sets attained through music education can be carried on throughout life to literally continue playing an instrument until the age of eighty for enjoyment and pleasure, or directly translated to practically any goal in life. Playing and performing in an ensemble teaches a musician or performer to be accountable for their part while maintaining an awareness of the ever-changing ensemble. Music performance is troubleshooting "on the go", diligence, calculations, translations, discipline, language, expression, self-awareness, math, science, dedication, and love.

Robust Fine Arts offerings are indicators of a healthy school system where students have choices when considering co-curricular activities (those that enhance classroom learning). As a general rule, ten percent of a school's population should be enrolled in band, in systems where Fine Arts are equitably supported. Presently, FS Bands is short of that marker, but in order to pursue it diligently, the proper resources need to be in place so that as new students enroll in our ensembles, the resources necessary for their success (and group's) are already in place. The FS Bands are supported by the FS Band Boosters, a non-profit 501(c)3 organization with the mission of addressing all aspects of the band program at Simpson County Schools.

The Franklin-Simpson Band Boosters and members of the band program fundraise ninety percent of the program's annual budget. These funds go directly to the band program for necessities like instruments, instrument repairs, uniforms, contest registration and travel, show & drill design, music composition, sound equipment, etc. Funding a successful band is expensive, as are the different elements of a marching band production. In recent decades, a marching band no longer cadences on the field, performs a half-time show, and cadences off. Productions are now taken on the road to compete in marching competitions across the state and nation. Participation and successful showing in these events requires sound support through electronics, athletic uniforms that make a greater range of motion visually effective, bold props, and the means to transport them. The request of FS Bands for the Education Excellence Grant is to contribute to their goal of doubling the Band Boosters Annual Budget in order to increase the performance capabilities of the band, attract and retain more middle school band students for the high school program, and increase the overall membership of the FS Band Program.

The Education Excellence Grant may be applied to any of the following needs of the band program: Trailer, Generator, Tubas/ Sousaphones, Winter Guard Tarp, Drumline, Sound System Upgrades, or Props (estimates below). An additional trailer, generator, drumline, speaker upgrades, and props are needed for the Fall 2024 marching season (and beyond) that would be ordered in Spring 2024. Tubas/ Sousaphones and a winter guard tarp are immediate needs that could be ordered upon awarding of the grant funds. These are examples of some of the needs of the band program at present, but in no way reflect all of the needs of the program. Upon being awarded any grant, the Booster Board would review the grant with the Director of Bands at their next monthly meeting, vote on the disbursement of the funds, and move forward accordingly. The FS Band Boosters hold meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order and motion all major expenditures not part of the annual budget to a vote. All expenses of the group are recorded by the Treasurer and made available to all for the purposes of accountability and improvement. The items mentioned are necessities of a successful marching band and winterguard. Students are "making due" with equipment and supplies well beyond their serviceable life. Receiving funds to purchase new tubas/ sousaphones, a new drumline or an additional trailer, would put equipment in the hands of students that want to play and allow the band to transport their production to marching band competitions.

If awarded any amount toward any of the above described needs, FS Bands will continue to grow both in numbers of participants and in successful performance. We are one of the most visible student groups in Simpson County as we perform concerts, appear at civic events/ parades, and show up to support our athletics! Supporting the needs outlined will supplement existing opportunities and facilitate effective learning through strengthening our school's ensembles.
