1. STUDENTS TAKE KSA'S EVERY SPRING

READING & MATH = 3-8, 10 SOCIAL STUDIES = 5, 8, 11 SCIENCE = 4, 7, 11 WRITING & EDITING MECHANICS = 5, 8, 11

2. <u>CUT SCORES</u> ARE ESTABLISHED TO DETERMINE NOVICE, APPRENTICE, PROFICIENT, DISTINGUISHED STUDENT LEVELS

3. POINTS ARE CALCULATED WITH EACH ASSESSMENT.

0 POINTS = NOVICE 0.5 POINTS = APPRENTICE 1 POINT = PROFICIENT 1.25 POINTS = DISTINGUISHED

4. TOTAL POINTS ARE AVERAGED FOR <u>TWO</u> CATEGORIES OF ACCOUNTABILITY:

CATEGORY 1 = READING & MATH
CATEGORY 2 = SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES, & COMBINED WRITING (ON-DEMAND & EDITING MECHANICS)






