The Power of Literacy

What is Literacy?

What: The creative and analytical ability to identify, understand, interpret, create, compute, and communicate, using visual, audible, and digital texts across disciplines.

How: The development of **literacy skills is on a continuum** allowing for individuals to utilize it over **varying contexts** and with **varying abilities**.

Why: Literacy is a **moral imperative** because it gives humans the ability to articulate our experiences and interact with others to improve the world around us.

The Five Components of Literacy



Phonemic awareness is an understanding of phonemes, or the smallest units of spoken language which combine to create syllables and words. Phonemic awareness is the ability to isolate, identify, focus on, and manipulate sounds in spoken words.

Phonics is the relationship between letters and sounds in written language. A student who is strong in phonics is able to sound out and spell different words.

Fluency is the ability to read quickly and accurately, and comes about when the reader has mastered enough decoding skills to focus on the meaning of the text.

Vocabulary is the amount of words with which the reader is familiar. The larger a student's vocabulary is, the easier it is for them to derive meaning from the text.

Comprehension is the ultimate goal of literacy. It is the reader's ability to understand and make sense of written text.


MAP Fluency Diagnostic


Students who score below 60% on MAP Growth took the MAP Reading Fluency assessment

MAP Fluency for EL Schools: Grades 1-2

Elementary schools who have used EL Skills Block for 2 or more years have stronger fluency skills compared to those schools only using for 1 year.





KSA Data for EL Schools

Elementary schools who have used EL saw gains in proficiency rates and declines in novices, with greater improvements in schools using EL for 2 or more years

Literacy Best Practice "Look Fors"

During August and September, JCPS school and district leaders conducted close to **5,000 observations of K-8 classrooms** and look fors were evident 75% of the time.

During October, a team made up of JCPS and EL staff visited 21 schools to check on implementation and provide coaching and support.

- 80% of the indicators were evident or somewhat evident across 841 observations
- Strengths teachers demonstrated evidence of advanced preparation and use quick checks for understanding
- Areas for improvement teachers use protocols to allow students to build upon each other's responses and promote equity of voice

Frequency Recommendations

- Set up a system to visit each teacher
- during literacy block/course once a week. · Embed the Look For Language into your current tool.
- Use the exact verbiage to ensure the data pull for ARSI is correct. Assign a Team Member to be in charge AIC or AP, etc.

K-2 Skills Block

- I. Teachers set up routines and procedures that are familiar to the students
- 2.Students complete assigned activities during independent rotations.




