# **VI. Superintendent's Report**

Dr. Pollio highlighted some changes in the way that the Board will conduct meetings and Board business moving forward as they work with the Council of Great City Schools in a new governance model.

#### VII. Student Outcomes-Focused Governance Update and Adoption of Goals & Guardrails

Dr. Pollio discussed the proposed options and the work that went into creating the Goals and Guardrails. Each Board member had an opportunity to comment and ask questions.

Ms. McIntosh shared concerns in Option 1 with using the student growth percentile ranking/scale. She stated that in order for our students to improve, not only do they have to demonstrate growth, but they would have to demonstrate growth at a faster rate than other students nationwide who are also taking the MAP test.

Mr. Marshall questioned growth versus percentile. He said, "I know that in our Retreat it seemed like there was more consensus from the Board that we were looking more at growth versus proficiency and percentile. So, can we talk a little bit about this word proficiency because I think there's a lot of confusion over what it really means and whether or not that means my kid can read or not if they score proficient or not on these assessments?" He then asked for more discussion regarding the lack of a baseline as they are trying to measure growth. He said, "When we talk about the JCPS Academic Readiness Measure, during the Retreat there was a lot of conversation around how we balance these decontextualized assessments with more of the deeper learning approach that the backpack is trying to reach."

Mrs. Duncan stated, "I prefer option three. It seems to me to make the most sense and we can use the fifth-grade readiness and the eighth-grade readiness as interim measures, but it really targets our priorities in a way that I think is important with twelfth-grade and then third-grade literacy and eighth-grade math." She shared the following suggestions that she had received: add teacher collaboration and REAP to the Guardrails and make sure they do not over-assess beyond mandated assessments. She said, "I don't want us to keep adding assessments to create more things to monitor."

Mr. Craig said, "If we're shooting for Goals that would exceed the national average, do we have any examples or can you think of any other districts that have been able to get that much growth over the period of time that we're hoping to attain that growth? I guess similar to the concern I articulated to you guys earlier, are we setting ourselves up for failure by using this particular growth tool as the standard by which to judge the superintendent? He later asked, "By 2030, at the end of this period, what would we project our ML Learners to be - what percentage of the District's population?" He expressed concern with using MAP or the other indicators as the measure of growth as shown for Goals four and five. He stated that he would prefer to postpone the vote to obtain more stakeholder buy-in.

Dr. Kolb stated that he isn't convinced they should move away from what was decided at the Retreat. For him, a key issue is what they choose to use as the final model for the readiness measure. He thought there was near consensus at the Retreat regarding doing a lot of work to capture the students' successes and abilities that are more difficult to capture and that typically fall outside the realm of a standardized type of assessment. He would like to learn more about appropriate benchmarks and measures before making a decision. He prefers to get away from proficiency and distinguished. He stated that he does not like the 60<sup>th</sup> percentile, it is not a good measure, and grade-level seems like an appropriate target. He said, "I prefer to see us broaden the group of students that we're trying to get to a certain level as opposed to a smaller group at a higher level."

Ms. Logan Strange said, "I agree with Dr. Kolb, I think the original document, the original goals are substantial enough and weighty enough that these should be the goals that we reach for. I also agree that teachers and others, and I'm going to call them stakeholders because it's more than just teachers, should have an opportunity to at least express an opinion."

Chair Shull said, "I think that everyone who is a part of the educational process, it is important that their voices are not just heard now during this process, but that their voices are continually heard - that we continue to extend an invitation to them to come to the table."

The Board then decided to postpone the adoption of Goals and Guardrails with a motion by Mr. Craig.

Ms. McIntosh wanted to ensure that the District doesn't continue to have shortages and asked, "I understand that for this particular year's budget, staffing shortages are kind of giving us a cushion, so to speak, in terms of our financial obligations but are we working on plans for 25-26, 26-27, and looking outward?" She then asked, "Would those long-term forecasts account for any increases with regard to salary for staff?"

Mrs. Duncan asked, "I notice where it says 64% local effort, 12% State effort, and then 0.2% Federal effort and revenue for our schools but then there is also that state-funded benefits – so, would you really put those together and say State is actually 34% rather than just 12%?

Mr. Craig requested a 2024 budget myth-buster one-pager. He stated that he was able to get most of his questions addressed before the meeting.

Dr. Kolb questioned the Support Education Excellence in Kentucky (SEEK) funding formula. He asked, "Could you explain the less 30% local effort tax assessments - what does that mean? He said, "I just want to underscore the point that if raises are going to be had, if further Investments are going to be made in our schools, and our kids, it's going to have to come from the seven of us. There's nobody else that's going to provide it and that's why I will never vote to lower the tax rate. I think it's unethical to do so and I think we need to go significantly above, as a general rule, every year and let the public decide."

Ms. Logan Strange asked for clarification on how the District came to have a budget deficit.

Chair Shull asked, "As it relates to the enrollment projections, can you talk to us a little bit about the choice Zone?" He also questioned facility space for Grace James Academy.
