Purpose of Funding: I am requesting funding to help support 5 FSHS students (1 sophomore, 2 juniors, 2 seniors) who are members of the WKU Young Male Leadership Academy. This funding will help support their competing at the State and National Educators Rising Competition which is a network of rising educators and teachers leaders who come together to learn from each other through breakout sessions, network with other other future educators around the state and country, and compete in competitive events that allow students to develop and showcase their teaching skills.

Brief Summary of Project (2 - 3 Sentences):

The WKU Young Male Leadership Academy is a college preparation and recruitment initiative, which develops leadership skills in young males of diverse backgrounds by exploring the teaching profession. The goal of the organization is to increase the awareness of teacher opportunities and the rewards associated with the teaching profession, to establish a pipeline of minority students interested in the teaching profession, to provide mentoring opportunities for underrepresented male populations in the teaching profession, and enhance the educational preparedness of students interested in the teaching profession.

Franklin-Simpson High School has participated in this program for three years and we have five young males of color who are currently enrolled in this program. As part of the program, the young men compete at the state Educators Rising Competition which is held in Louisville, KY and at the National Educators Rising Competition which is being held in Washington DC this summer. The students from FSHS are competing in the categories of Researching Learning Challenges where they have to research and make a presentation on a particular learning disability/challenge that faces students in school and ways students can overcome that challenge. They are also competing in the Public Service Announcement category where they will present a PSA on teacher recruitment, as well as Impromptu Speaking. The \$1,500 per young man being requested will help offset the cost for registration for the competitions, allowing the boys to travel and attend both conferences,

and participate in additional activities while at the national competition. Last year, the cost to attend state and national competition for the 23 boys in the program was around \$30,000. The Dean of the College of Education at WKU, Dr. Murphy contributes to the cost of funding this initiative as well as each school/district. Mr. Schlosser has been supportive of the program for the FSHS boys to participate over the last two years. Specifically, monies supplied will help to pay for registration, transportation (charter bus) and food (breakfast and dinner) to Louisville, KY on March 6th for the state level competition. The funds provided will also help to pay for the registration, food, transportation, and lodging for the young men as they travel to compete at the national level in Washington, D.C June 28th-July 1st of this year. While in DC, the young men will not only participate in the competition, but will also visit museums such as the African-American History Museum, the Museum of Natural History, and the National Mall in downtown DC. The monies will be used to supply each young man with 2 WKU YMLA Polos (gray and red) which they wear to the competitions and the fees/registrations that go along with competing.

The young men from FSHS the last two years have placed at the state and national levels in their categories. Two of the young men from FSHS are seniors this year and are planning to go into the teaching profession which lets us know that the experience and mentorship they are receiving from this program is making an impact. The young men within the program are supported by Dr. Devanee Lasley who is the Program Coordinator and Advisor within the WKU Teacher Recruitment Office, Mr. Michael Coleman, Mr. Chris Stunson, and Mrs. J'Nora Anderson who all serve as Program Coordinators/Advisors/School Liaisons. The WKU Young Male Leadership Academy has been in existence since 2007 and has supported thousands of young men in continuing their education at the post-secondary level as well as helping them to matriculate into the education profession. We hope that you will consider funding this opportunity for the young men to continue their involvement in the program and to be able to go and compete at both the state and national levels in their respective categories. YMLA has diligently served its communities as a great tool to introduce the Education profession to young men of diverse backgrounds. It is a tool we are using to help support and push potential individuals down the educator pipeline to come back and work within the Simpson County School System. This program and others like it are how we "grow our own" and get more individuals, specifically, more males of color interested into the field of education. Not only are we gaining their interest in an education career, we are preparing them for any workforce by teaching them skills such as effective communication, leadership, and integrity.
