PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The work is conducted in a school setting. This position has environmental conditions with protection from weather conditions but not necessarily from temperature changes or atmospheric conditions while working on performance responsibilities.

This position requires the following physical activities frequently (more than 85% of the workweek): balancing, bending, climbing, crawling, crouching, driving, kneeling, reaching, lifting, pushing, pulling, standing, and walking. Repetitive motions and visual acuity are required constantly (up to 100% or the workweek), feeling, grasping, hearing, and talking are required (up to 100% of the workweek).
