ACHIEVEMENT

Teachers shall maintain detailed, systematic records of the achievement of each student. Teachers in primary school through grade twelve shall formally report every nine (9) weeks to the parent or guardian on the progress of their child.

Reports of unsatisfactory progress shall be sent to parents/guardians midway through the reporting period.

A student's academic grade shall not be lowered as a disciplinary action.

ACADEMIC GRADING SCALES

Primary teachers shall distribute progressive non-graded reports to indicate a child's progress in the primary school program. Each primary teacher shall provide parents/guardians with a comprehensive report that is based on samples of their child's work and that includes a descriptive, narrative evaluation of all aspects of the child's progress. The following rubric will be utilized for students in grades kindergarten through second (K-2):
