Each Tuesday morning, our district facilities team meets to review submitted work orders and discuss maintenance projects that need to be completed throughout the district.

- 11/20/25 Attended a Bluegrass Risk Management meeting in Lexington, KY with other districts that are also members of the group. Bluegrass Risk Management provides insurance for our school buildings, property, and liability issues.

Standard 2: Instructional Leadership

This month, I want to highlight the work we've been doing around Standard 2: Instructional Leadership. Throughout November and December, our district and school leadership teams have invested significant time in developing our Comprehensive District and School Improvement Plans (CDIP and CSIP).

Together, we completed detailed needs assessments—taking an honest look at our current performance, our desired state, and what the data reveals about the gap between the two. This process helped us identify our highest-priority needs so we can focus our time, attention, and resources on the areas that will make the greatest impact for students.

From there, we conducted root cause analyses to better understand the factors contributing to our challenges. Those findings directly shaped the goals, objectives, strategies, and activities included in both the CDIP and CSIP.

This year, we were especially intentional about aligning our work from preschool through 12th grade and narrowing our priorities so our efforts remain focused and meaningful.
