

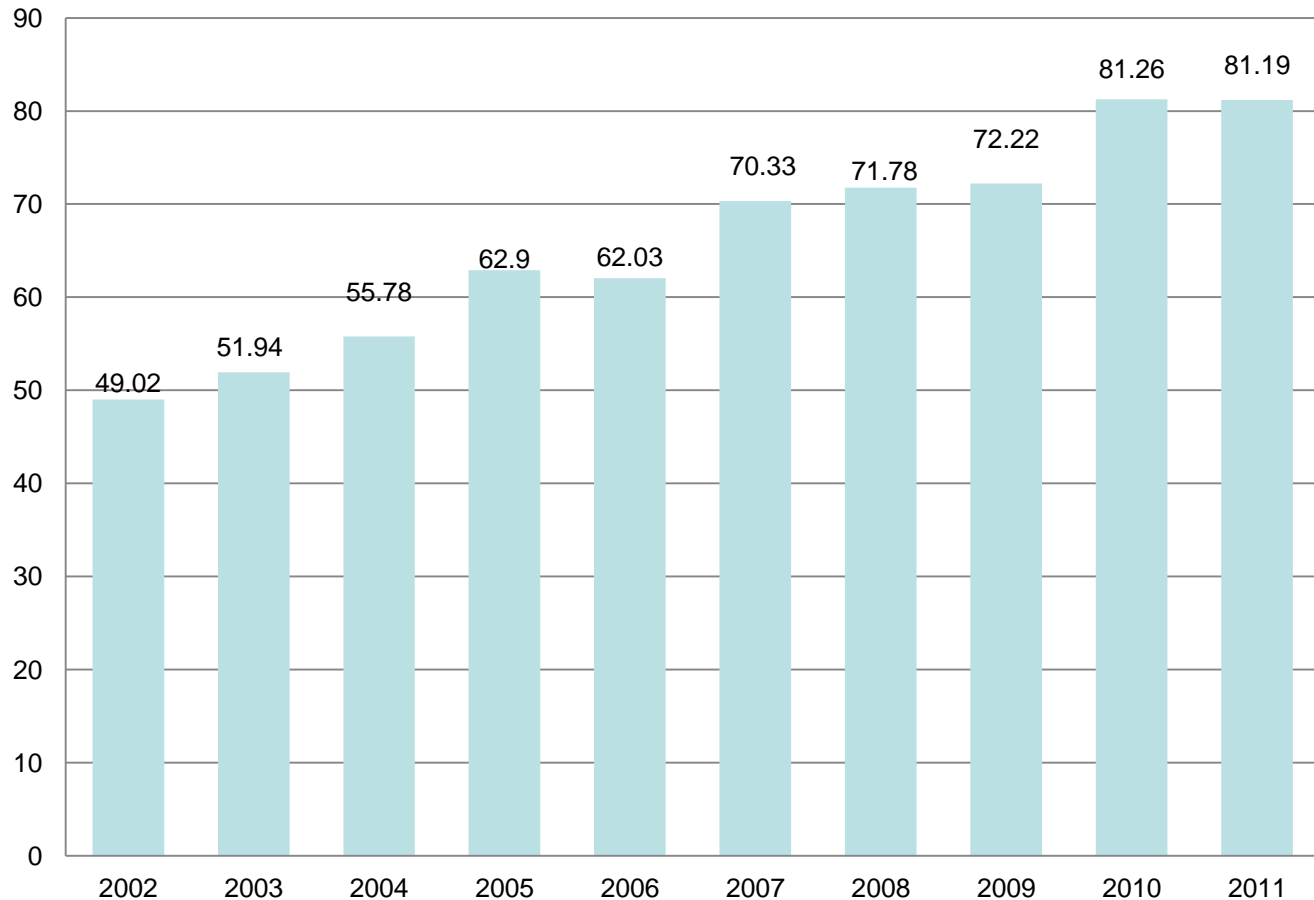

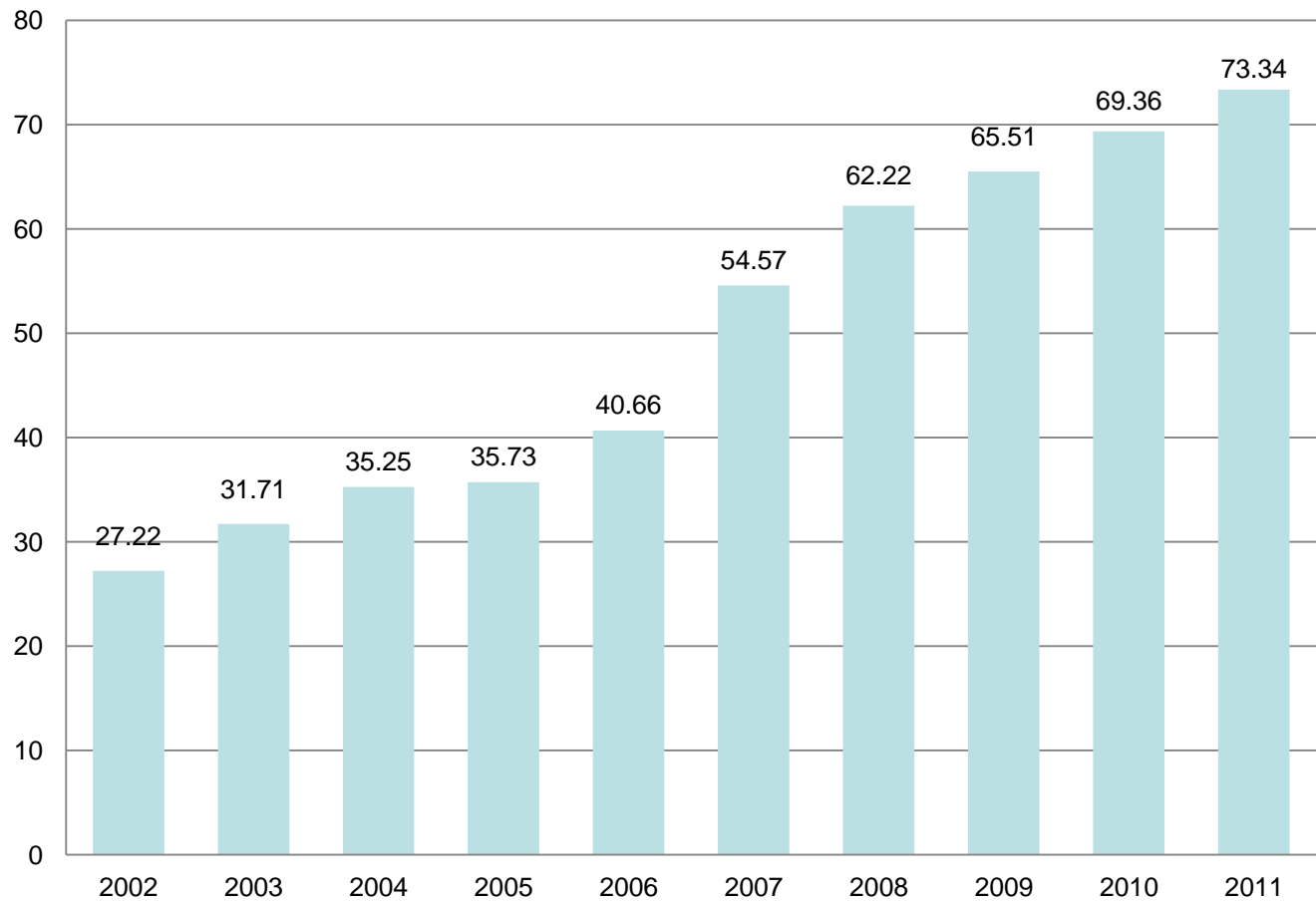
Reading Proficiency 2002-2011

Observations – District:

- Rank **12th** of 169 K-12 districts in Reading/Math combined proficiency
- Reading - **32%** increase since the inception of No Child Left Behind
- Math - **46%** increase since the inception of No Child Left Behind
- Graduation Rate increased **4%** over the past year at a time when most districts saw a drop with the new formula.
- Science, Social Studies and Writing On-Demand - **4.35%** increase in Proficient/Distinguished scores from 2010 to 2011.
- College/Career Readiness - increased by **9%** from 2010 rate to 42% for the district and increased by **7%** at HCHS to 45%.



Observations – Elementary:

- Reading – 86.36% **rank 11th** out of 174 districts **(top 6%)** in the state.
- Math – 79.5% rank 28th **(top 16%)**
- Science – 81.65% rank 35th **(top 20%)**
- Social Studies – 67.16% rank 53rd **(top 30%)**
- On Demand Writing – 68.45% rank 41st **(top 23%)**
- **Reading, Math and Science** elementary scores were the **highest** among our neighboring districts (Daviness, Union, and Webster).



Observations – Middle:

- Reading –78.71% rank 27th **(top 15%)**
- Math –75.27% rank 28th **(top 16%)** in the state.
- Science scores increased **10.68%** from 2010 to 2011.
- Social Studies increased **14.5%** over the past 3 years.
- On Demand Writing increased **6%** over the past 3 years.
- Middle school **Math** scores were the **highest** among our neighboring districts (Daviness, Union, and Webster).



Observations – High School:

- Reading – 72.83% rank 40th **(top 23%)**
- Math – 46.65% rank 67th **(top 40%)**
- Science – 47% rank 48th **(top 28%)**
- Social Studies – 56.37% **rank 13th (top 7%)**
- On Demand Writing – 48% rank 30th **(top 17%)**
- High school scores in **all five (5)** content areas were the highest among our neighboring districts (Daviness, Union, and Webster).



Observations – High School:

- Reading scores increased **20%** over the past 4 years.
- Math scores increased **19%** over the past 3 years.
- Science scores increased **13%** over the past 4 years.
- Social Studies increased nearly **24%** over the past 3 years.
- On Demand Writing increased **30%** over the past 4 years.
- Graduation Rate increased **4%** over the past year.
- Met four (4) additional Target Goals in 2011 for a **25%** increase since 2010.
