

Restorative Justice & Restorative Practice

Restorative Justice (RJ) is a process being discussed nationally and in the local community as a theory of justice that emphasizes repairing the harm caused by criminal behavior through the legal/court system.

Restorative Practices (RP) are efforts to apply those principles to the school setting.

The focus of RJ and RP is placed on: identifying and repairing the harm caused by criminal/behavioral events; restoration for those who have been injured; and successful reintegration of offenders to society as contributing members.

Goal: Review Restorative Justice & Restorative Practice as they relate to implementation in communities and schools.

Strategy: Visit and discuss with other schools/districts implementing Restorative Practices.
