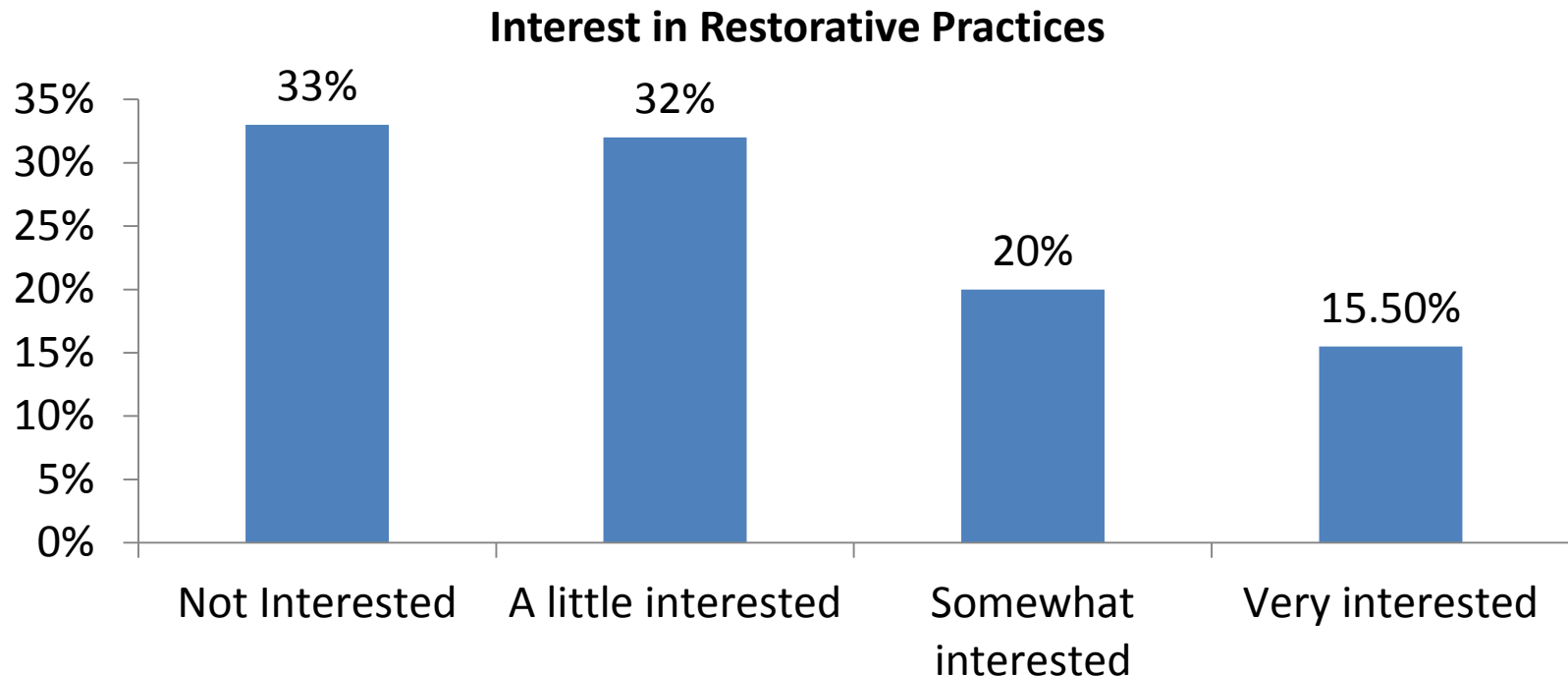


# Restorative Practices

- District leaders attended an informational session/training on Restorative Practices on July 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012.
- A follow-up survey was sent in early August to assess participant reactions.
- 118 Respondents comprising of 71 elementary schools, 17 middle schools, 17 high schools, and 13 combined/special schools.

# Restorative Practices Survey Results

- Half of the respondents (50%) reported their schools already used similar strategies as Restorative Practices (i.e., affective statements, affective questions, small conferences, group/circles, formal student conferences).
- Schools were asked their level of interest in implementing Restorative Practices.



# Restorative Practices Survey Results

- Of those schools ‘somewhat’ or ‘very’ interested,
  - 17 elementary, 6 middle, 5 high, 4 special
  - 19 of the 32 interested schools already use “similar” strategies to restorative practices.
