Replace HVAC system including original boilers and chillers. Consider geothermal system where possible. Rework combustion air intakes in boiler room and protect fire protection service from freezing potential. Tie HVAC control systems to the newer portions of the building. Rework/replace individual HVAC units in classrooms and stairway and halls. Inspect and replace oldest portions of roof on building.
