The data also informs us that we are seeing success in Social Studies and Science Content areas.

The data does not present a clear distinction as to why the Elementary Program as well as Math at all levels is not delivering the results expected for student achievement.

Math is a major area in need of improvement. We have taken steps to further deconstruct and align the curriculum to the standards. Additionally, professional development and meeting with our KDE Content Network Specialist have been implemented.

Additional professional development has been implemented to address reading and writing with a focus on teaching and emphasizing literacy in all content areas and grade levels.

We have also taken steps to adjust our RTI and ESS Program to meet the needs of our learners.

Additionally, with in influx of student population and a change in demographics we need to promote the positive Southgate School Culture.

Oversight and Monitoring

Work done in professional development and included in our CDIP will be reguarly monitored by administration and SBDM Council. Students not learning are assessed and progress monitored on a regular basis by using MAP and Aimsweb.

7) Adjust School Schedule to provide non-compromising focus on instruction.

8) Evaluate School Climate and promote a positive environment where success is celebrated along with goal-setting and student selfmonitoring.
