Spencer County is a small, rural community just a few miles southeast of Jefferson County. There are approximately 2700 students who attend Spencer County Schools. Spencer County has limited diversity which the student population reflects with a very small portion of Hispanics or African Americans. The district has approximately 40% of students who qualify for Free/Reduced Lunches. Both the attendance rate and the graduation rate are above the state average.

Spencer County Schools includes Spencer County Preschool, Taylorsville Elementary, Spencer County Elementary School, Spencer County Middle School, Spencer County High School, and Hillview Academy.

Spencer County Schools provide an exemplary educational program for students from preschool through 12th grade. There are a variety of academic offerings including before- and- after school clubs or programs, a summer academy, and numerous extra- and co-curricular offerings.

Notable Achievements

Spencer County Schools has moved up in the district rankings within Kentucky to the 75th percentile which is considered a Proficient District. Spencer County is ranked third among the OVEC districts on 2011-12 K-PREP scores. Spencer County Elementary is considered a Distinguished School with a ranking at the 90th percentile. Taylorsville Elementary is considered a Proficient School with a ranking at the 73rd percentile. Spencer County Middle School and Spencer County High School are both in the "Needs Improvement" category but have moved up in the rankings considerably from three years ago.

Reading at all schools is above the state average for all students and Gap students according to the 2011/12 K-PREP scores. Spencer County Elementary scored above the state in all content areas for Achievement, Gap, and Growth. Taylorsville Elementary scored above the state in Achievement and Gap in the following areas: reading, math, science, writing, and language mechanics. TES also scored above the state in Growth in Math and Combined Reading and Math. Spencer County Middle School scored above the state in Achievement in the following areas: reading, math, and social studies. SCMS also scored above the state in Gap in reading, math, science, and social studies. SCMS scored above the state average in Achievement and Gap in reading, writing, and language mechanics. SCHS also scored at the state average in College/Career Readiness.

Spencer County Schools is ranked 7th in the "Bang for Your Bucks" Report by the Bluegrass Institute. This report compares each district's per student expenditure with their ACT score to determine which districts are being the most academically successful while using the least amount of funding.

Spencer County Schools is one of only ten school districts in Kentucky to receive the College Board's 2012 AP Honor Roll Award. Specific criteria is used in determining this award including increased access to AP courses and improving performance levels when comparing the percentage of exams scoring 3 or higher from 2010 to 2012.
