Introduction

Gallatin County High School is a rural school with a population of 452, serving students from grades nine through twelve. Our school population is 93% Caucasian, 2% African American, and 5% Hispanic. We serve 67% of our students a free and reduced lunch. Our students are transient, moving in and out of our district several times throughout their school career. Many of our high school students live with grandparents or other relatives, and some live on their own with various friends. We have incorporated a School Within A School for struggling students and we have 5-6 students enrolled in our Alternative School. We continue to work very hard to ensure that our students graduate college and career ready. We have put into place programs such as e-Prep and KYOTE, and we have also incorporated Rtl into our regular daily schedule. We work very hard to establish the importance of post secondary success. Challenges we face are the lack of resources either financial or non-availability. Most adults commute here to work from neighboring communities. There are only three major employers in the county, one of which is our school system. We have a fairly young staff, and the majority of them live outside the district. Also, our district pay scale is lower than surrounding districts, so we eventually lose many of our good teachers. Another challenge is the ability to contact parents. Phone numbers are changed or disconnected frequently making contact with parents very difficult.
