## PRE-ALGEBRA SELECTION CRITERIA POLICY

## POLICY STATEMENT

Any junior high student who is behind course level in $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math upon completion of the course may be assigned to a required transitional course instead of progressing to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors their freshman year. The transitional course will not satisfy the graduation requirement for Algebra 1, Algebra 2 or Geometry, but will serve as a required $4^{\text {th }}$ year mathematics. Students currently taking $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math may advance to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors by meeting one of the following options:

1. With teacher recommendation a student will be allowed to progress from $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors if they earn a $73 \%$ or higher for the average of their $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ semester grades and score a $75 \%$ or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of $8^{\mathrm{th}}$ grade math.
2. If a student does not make $75 \%$ or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math then they will be allowed to progress from $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors if they earn an $83 \%$ or better for the average of their 1 st and 2 nd semester grades.

Due to the transition of the Kentucky core academic standards, if a student makes a $70 \%$ or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math they will be allowed to progress from $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math to Algebra I or Algebra I Honors.
