## POLICY STATEMENT

Any junior high student who is behind course level in 8<sup>th</sup> grade math upon completion of the course may be assigned to a required transitional course instead of progressing to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors their freshman year. The transitional course will not satisfy the graduation requirement for Algebra 1, Algebra 2 or Geometry, but will serve as a required 4<sup>th</sup> year mathematics. Students currently taking 8<sup>th</sup> grade math may advance to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors by meeting one of the following options:

- 1. With teacher recommendation a student will be allowed to progress from 8<sup>th</sup> grade math to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors if they earn a 73% or higher for the average of their 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester grades and score a 75% or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of 8<sup>th</sup> grade math.
- 2. If a student does not make 75% or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of 8<sup>th</sup> grade math then they will be allowed to progress from 8<sup>th</sup> grade math to Algebra 1 or Algebra 1 Honors if they earn an 83% or better for the average of their 1st and 2nd semester grades.

Due to the transition of the Kentucky core academic standards, if a student makes a 70% or higher on an end of course comprehensive exam representative of the year-long study of the 8<sup>th</sup> grade math they will be allowed to progress from 8<sup>th</sup> grade math to Algebra I or Algebra I Honors.
