MUHLENBERG COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT

A public hearing was held at the Muhlenberg County School Board of Education Central Office on May 9, 2013, at 6:00 pm. The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Muhlenberg County Schools Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted 13 to 0 in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 5 to 0 to approve the new plan.

There were no public participants in attendance for the hearing. Scott Noel, LPC Facilitator, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer. Those present to hear the report was (1) Public Citizen, and (4) Muhlenberg County School Board Members.

COMMENTS

Scott Noel, Hearing Officer called the public hearing to order. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would also be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Department of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed new District Facility Plan which includes;

- 1. Changing the organizational plan of the (5) Elementary Schools to K-5.
- 2. Longest Elementary is now listed as "Transitional" To be replaced with a new facility.
- 3. Priority 1b, #1. Muhlenberg County West Campus; Construct a Culinary Art Lab.
- 4. Priority 1b, #2. Construct a new Longest Elementary School 600 Student Capacity.
- 5. Priority 2b, #1. Construct a new Early Childhood Center 400 Student Capacity.
- 6. Priority 2c, #1. Central City Elementary to receive Major Renovations with Additions.
- 7. Priority 2c, #2. Renaissance / Vocational School to receive Major Renovations with Additions.
- 8. Priority 2c, #3. Muhlenberg North Middle School to receive Major Renovations to 1950 Gymnasium.
- Priority 2c, #4. Muhlenberg County High School West Campus to receive Major Renovations with Additions.
- 10. Priority 2c, #5. Muhlenberg County High School East Campus to receive Major Renovations with Additions.
- 11. Priority 2c, #6. Muhlenberg County South Middle School (Open Concept) to receive Major Renovations with Additions.
- 12. Priority 4, #1. Central Office to receive Major Renovations with Board Room Addition.
- 13. Priority 4, #2. Central Bus Garage to receive Minor Renovations to meet ADA and Life Safety Requirements.

These priority construction items give the district a total need of \$54,525,019.



- 14. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #1. Muhlenberg County High School West Campus to receive the following:
 - a. Upgrade existing athletic fields (irrigation, fencing, bleachers, etc.) for soccer, softball (Title IX), band and football practice areas.
 - b. (4) Standard Classroom Addition
 - c. (1) Cafeteria Addition
 - d. (1) Natatorium
- 15. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #2. Muhlenberg County High School East Campus to receive the following:
 - a. Upgrade existing athletic fields (irrigation, fencing, bleachers, etc.) for soccer, softball (Title IX), band and football practice areas.
- 16. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #3. Muhlenberg County South Elementary School to receive the following:
 - a. Construct athletic fields for soccer and football.
 - b. (1) Auditorium Addition
- 17. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #4. Muhlenberg County North Middle School to receive the following:
 - a. Upgrade existing football field, construct new concession building with restrooms.
- 18. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #5. Greenville Elementary School to receive the following:
 - a. (1) Auditorium Addition
- 19. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #6. Longest Elementary School to receive the following: a. (1) Auditorium Addition
- 20. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #7. Central City Elementary School to receive the following:
 - a. (1) Auditorium Addition
- 21. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #8. Bremen Elementary School to receive the following: a. (1) Auditorium Addition
- 22. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #9. Muhlenberg County High School West Campus to receive the following:
 - a. (1) Freshman Academy 500 Student Capacity.
- 23. Priority 5, Discretionary Project #10. Bremen Elementary School to receive the following:
 - a. Construct Athletic Ball Fields, Lighting, Press Box, Concession & Dugouts.



The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. There were no statements to be heard or read.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Muhlenberg County Schools Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Muhlenberg County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Muhlenberg County School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
