ROCKCASTLE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT

A public hearing was held at the Rockcastle County Teaching and Learning Center on April 23, 2013, at 6:00 pm. The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Rockcastle County Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted 18 to 0 in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 5 to 0 to approve the new plan.

There were no public participants in attendance for the hearing. Scott Noel, LPC Facilitator, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer. Those present to hear the report were (3) LPC Members, and (1) Rockcastle County School Board Members, and the Rockcastle County Facilities Director.

COMMENTS

Scott Noel, Board Appointed Hearing Officer called the public hearing to order. The purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures were reviewed indicating they were in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would also be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Department of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed new District Facility Plan which includes;

- 1. Changing the Long Range School Organization Plan to a PS, K-5, 6-8, 9-12.
- 2. Change all elementary schools to become Permanent, K-5 School Centers.
- 3. Priority 2a, #1, Construct a new Rockcastle County Early Childhood Center 200 Capacity.
- 4. Priority 2c, #1 Roundstone Elementary School to receive major renovations with additions.
- 5. Priority 2c, #2 Mt. Vernon Elementary School to receive major renovations with additions.
- 6. Priority 2c, #3 Rockcastle Middle School to receive major renovations with additions.
- 7. Priority 2c, #4 Rockcastle High School to receive minor renovations with additions.
- 8. Priority 2c, #5 Academy for Academic Achievement / District Storage to receive major renovations to building not previously renovated.
- 9. Priority 2d, #1 District has indicated 150 classrooms for District White Board Initiative.
- 10. Priority 4, #1 Central Board Office to receive major renovations.
- 11. Priority 4, #2 Teaching and Learning Center to receive major renovations.
- 12. Priority 4, #3 Central Bus Garage to receive major renovations.

These priority construction items give the district a total need of \$36,204,766.

13. Priority 5, Discretionary Item #1, Mt. Vernon Elementary to receive minor renovations to include; Lighting, Interior Finishes (Ceilings), Casework and Kitchen Plumbing Line System.



14. Priority 5, Discretionary Item #2, Rockcastle County High School to receive Lighting and Media Center Flooring.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. There were no statements to be heard or read.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Rockcastle County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Rockcastle County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Rockcastle County School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
