- ➤ CHHS FFA traveled to Indianapolis along with 56,000 other FFA members to participate in the 85th National Convention. The Central Hardin FFA volunteered with the **Kids Against Hunger** organization and helped pack over 1,000,000 meals for needy families!
- The Bruin JROTC battalion conducted their 19th annual Cadet Ball at the Ft. Knox Sabre and Quill on November 10th. This event was one of the highlights of the year as nearly 150 Cadets and their guests enjoyed an evening of military ceremonial traditions and fun with friends.
- ➤ CHHS FCCLA hosted F.A.C.T.S. Week (Families Acting for Community Traffic Safety) September 24th 28th where FCCLA officers gave traffic safety tips to the student body about texting and driving, the importance of wearing your seatbelt, drinking and driving and other distracting driving hazards. They also partnered with Officers Ramsey and Willowby and gave out candy all week and had students to sign safety pledges.
- ➤ Central Hardin High School Marching Band had one of its most successful seasons in 20 years! The CHHS Marching Band took 1st PLACE in every regular season KMEA competition! The band was also a finalist at the Bands of America Louisville Regional in September, placed 2nd in the West Regional State Competition. At state, the band placed 6th overall in Class 5A competition in October and received their highest score at state since 1992. The band also participated in Bands of America Grand National Competition in Indianapolis November 9th 10th. Along with receiving a Rank 1 ("Distinguished Rating) at BOA Grand Nationals, their performance on Friday, November 9th at Lucas Oil Stadium placed them 4th in their class among bands from across the country!
- CHHS International Club participated once again in Trick or Treat for Unicef and raised \$360.00!
- ➤ Congratulations to Kendra Ball and Rachel Witten, Central Hardin High School seniors, for their status as two of the 16,000 National Merit Semifinalists in the 58th annual National Merit Scholarship program. - At the 2012 KYA convention December 3-4, 2012, CHHS senior K.J. Hall represented CHHS as Speaker of the House at the state Capitol and was recognized for her great parliamentarian skills. Garrett Kasey was elected Lieutenant Governor of the Premier Program. Chase Barnes was recognized as one of 5 "Outstanding Premier Authors", and his bill passed both houses. Jody Robinson was elected Speaker of the House for the Congressional program next year (this is for the most elite debaters). Jody Robinson was also recognized as being one of 3 "Statesmen Awards" for outstanding debate in the Congressional program. All of the CHHS legislative bills written by Clarence Lewis, Blake Pawley, Sierra Stark, Ryan Nichols, and Erin Langley were recognized as being "Outstanding Bill Authors" and all of their bills were signed by the governor into "law". Clarence Lewis was recognized for being an "Outstanding Delegate". Matt Redell won "Outstanding Advocate" (1 of 3) and was chosen to argue his case in front of the judicial program and WON- this is VERY difficult to do! Andrew Lee was recognized as one of 5 "Outstanding Speakers". Also, Hares Patel was the assistant to the governor. The governor, in his closing speech, honestly "wept" over what a great friend and help Hares had been the entire weekend! Central Hardin was recognized as a "Delegation of Excellence" and we also won for "Best Bill Packet" (best overall group of bills). There were over 1100students participating during the convention and CHHS excelled over schools such as Manual, Assumption, Apollo, Bowling Green, etc. KYA is the largest State Youth Assembly in the United States.
- ➤ CHHS freshman Dillon Miller graced the cover of the Hardin County Independent November 22nd! Dillon had a feature article about his experience thus far as a student pilot!
- ➤ CHHS Speech Team competed December 8th at WKU and of the 28 schools from 6 states (and of the small CHHS group), KJ Hall took Tournament Champion in *Broadcasting* with Kendra Ball placing 3rd in the same event. Kendra also placed 4th in *Open Storytelling*. This was the first competition for both of these young ladies this year!
- ➤ The CHHS JROTC Bruins advanced to the College Options Foundation Level II Academic and Leadership Bowls. All JROTC programs are eligible to participate. All Army JROTC programs are required to compete. Central Hardin was one of only 63 schools in the 7th Brigade (285 schools) that advanced in both bowls! Central Hardin was the only school in the county that qualified for both bowls each of the four years that the competition has been held! Level II will take place 1-15 February 1st-15th, 2013 on line. Academic Team: Alexis Mitchell, Thomas Davis, Mason Edlin and Madalaine Benedetti. Leadership Team: Tim Whitehouse, Joseph Higgs, James Grant and Deanne Earl.

- ➤ The Bruin JROTC Drill Team was selected to represent 7th Brigade JROTC in the Armed Division at this year's US Army Cadet Command JROTC Drill Nationals held in Louisville, KY on April 6, 2013! Central Hardin was one of seven programs out of the 285 programs selected to represent the 7th Brigade. 7th Brigade consists of schools in MI, OH, IN, KY, and TN. This was the FIRST time Central Hardin has competed at the Nationals!
- ➤ CHHS competed with Elizabethtown High School in December to see which school could raise the most money for their designated charity! CHHS collected \$4,000 on behalf of the Addison Jo Blair Foundation and designated January 4th as a "BLUE OUT" day. CHHS was declared the WINNER at the January 4th CHHS vs EHS boys basketball game!
- ➤ CHHS Science Honor Society sold Addison Jo Blair bracelets and collected \$350 for donation to the foundation.
- ➤ CHHS Science Honor Society sponsored a "Reindeer Run" on December 15th and profited approximately \$1,500 to support their organization!
- The CHHS International Club and Spanish Club adopted a family through the "Kindness at Christmas" program at Springhaven. The clubs sponsored "Hat Day" on December 14th in which students paid to wear a hat for the day and collected \$95 which was used to purchase gifts for the program!

- ➤ Central Hardin High School Band had 36 students that were selected to perform with the KMEA Fourth District All-District Band. Students were selected through an audition process and perform with students from other high schools on February 1st and 2nd.!
- ➤ 8 CHHS Term 2 Nurse Aide students attended their clinical experience at Kensington Manor January 19th -20th. Their Kentucky State Nurse Aide Exam was administered on Wednesday, February 13th.

Both students will compete at the National Beta Convention in Mobile, Alabama in June.

- The Central Hardin Army JROTC Drill Team traveled to Richmond, KY on February 9th and competed in the Eastern Kentucky University Pershing Rifles 7th Annual JROTC Drill Classic. The Bruins placed 3rd overall against 37 teams from Kentucky and Tennessee in the 5 event competition. Cadet/CPT Joseph Higgs commanded the 1st place Platoon IDR and 3rd place Platoon Inspection. He was also awarded the coveted Commander's Cup for his outstanding performance. Cadet/LTC Zach Kreider placed 2nd and Cadet/SFC Deanne Earls placed 5th out of over 500 cadets in the Individual Drill Regulation Armed Knockout event. Cadet/CPL Ravein Price-Fitzgerald placed 2nd out of over 500 cadets in the Individual Drill Regulation Unarmed Knockout event. The next competition for the Bruins will be February 23rd at Trotwood-Madison High School near Dayton, Ohio.

The combined efforts of the entire team earned CHHS 4th place overall in regional competition in what is easily considered to be the toughest region in the entire state for Speech Competitions!

- ➤ The CHHS Wind Ensemble performed at the state conference the 1st week of February! This was a huge honor for the band and the students did an excellent job!
