Superintendent's Report November 11, 2013

Chair Diane Porter, members of the Board; it is my pleasure to call your attention to a few items of special interest.

As today is Veterans Day, I would like to recognize the thousands of veterans who serve our country. At JCPS, we are fortunate to have dozens of veterans who are continuing to serve our community as employees within our schools.

Congratulations to duPont Manual and Louisville Male high schools, and the Brown School as one of Kentucky's top ten schools with the highest college- and career-ready (CCR) rates and to Western High School as one of Kentucky's top ten schools with the highest one year's growth in CCR rates.

I would like to recognize the India Community Foundation of Louisville. I was invited to attend the Diwali Festival yesterday as the Chief Guest and was presented with an award. The Indian community has approximately 15,000 members in the metro Louisville area.

The 15th District PTA and Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS), in conjunction with WAVE-TV, WAMZ-FM, and WHAS-AM, began the **Wear It Forward Coats for Kids** drive on November 4. **Wear It Forward** began when WAVE-TV anchor Dawne Gee saw the need of our students and asked how she could help. We are primarily in need of new and gently used coats but are also accepting sweatshirts, gloves, mittens, sweaters, and pants in all sizes, both child and adult.
