Mission:JCPSeSchool provides self-paced, mastery-based curriculum to students seeking online curriculum 365/24/7. Certified teachers collaborate to design, develop and teach curriculum via online learning system.

Vision: JCPSeSchool continues to provide online curriculum options for Jefferson County Public Schools and shares its content with partners all over the United States.

Describe Purpose of your program, including the ways the program supports the district's college and career readiness goals for students. JCPSeSchool creates online courses and modules designed to help students recover, accumulate and accelerate their academic portfolio. JCPSeSchool aligns curriculim with local, state and national content stadards. Our dual credit program (CollegNOW!) offers 39 hours of college credit through our partnership with KCTCS. JCPSeSchool has also created COMPASS test modules that aid students with review of skills necessary to succeed taking the COMPASS test.

Students that enroll in JCHS-JCPSeSchool (174) as a primary enrollment have access to a full time counselor and full high school course curriculum.

Initial Assessment:	Students applying to attend JCHS-JCPSeSchool (174) must attend an orientation session and score a minimum of 6.0 on the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE).
Program Planning: Identification of Behavioral Needs	Jefferson County High School is a voluntary academic alternative school. Student do not attend JCHS for reasons of behavior. Counselors and assistant principals will evaluate a student's behavior record to determine site and session placement and my create a behavior contract for that student.

All coursework is individualized and self-paced. Students receive one-on-one assistance and mentoring daily. Reteaching occurs whenever a students does not demonstrate competency on a formative or summative assessment. Additional assistance in math is available for all students.

5. Transition to A1 School

Assessment Tool Used for Exit	Jefferson County High School is a terminal (diploma awarding) voluntary alternative academic program. Students are not involuntarily assigned to JCHS. The overwhelming majority of students at JCHS plan to graduate from the program. For those students who wish to return to an A1 school, academic goals are set using the graduation plan (for course completions) and the Test of Adult Basic Education (where gains in basic skills are measured). These are documented on student goal sheets and the ILPA.
Exit Criteria for Academic Performance	On students transitioning back to A1 schools, the exit criteria varies widely based on student goals. Students who wish to return to an A1 school will have goals set collaboratively by the student, parents, and counselor. These will be documented on the ILPA. Before exit, the JCHS-JCPSeSchool counselor will work with the receiving school counselor to ensure a smooth transition.
	All other students exit when they graduate from JCHS. Efforts are made to ensure College/Career readiness for all graduates. College and career fairs are held to help students understand post-graduation opportunities. Counselors lead college field trips and discuss post-secondary education with all students.
	Students graduating from JCHS must meet all course and credit requirements, complete state-required testing, and score a minimum of 11.0 on the math and reading TABE.
