

ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL ENTRY AND EXIT PROCESS

Buechel Metro, Breckinridge Metro, Kennedy Metro:

- assigned by the district using the Board-approved "Student Code of Conduct"
- return to an A1 school after completing the specified program/criteria

Jefferson County High, Liberty, Phoenix, TAPP (Teen Age Pregnancy Program)*:

- not assigned--self-referred or referred by family or school staff
- remain until they graduate, unless transfer
- awarded diplomas under the school name

Note: A comprehensive intake and exit process has been implemented at each site.

*TAPP – South Park and Westport TAPP are for students who are pregnant/parenting and may return to graduate from an A1 school

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CHANGES OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS...

Creation of an Alternative School Task Force to inform:

- Redefining all Alternative Schools as Alternative Success Pathways
- Assigning all Alternative Schools to one of the six Academic Achievement Areas to increase collaboration with other schools
- Using ILPA (Individual Learning Plan Addendum) for every student except those students already having an IEP (Individual Education Plan)
- Placing Exceptional Child Education Students procedure for alternative schools' placement for ECE students has been changed to address the CAP (State ECE Corrective Action Plan)
- Working to connect students to Career and Technical Education (CTE)



... CHANGES OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS

- Seeking to increase availability and usage of CTE (Career and Tech Ed) programs
- Planning for changes due to compulsory education
- Monitoring College and Career Readiness on a weekly basis
- Developing plans and interventions unique to each school to increase attendance rates
- Developing plans and interventions unique to each school to increase graduation rates

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RECOMMENDATIONS/WORK PLANS FOR A5 SCHOOLS

- Continue to monitor and take action steps to increase College/Career Readiness through achievement area teams—tighten integration
- Consider opening seats to address COMPULSORY EDUCATION increases
- Assemble the Alternative School Task Force to develop an intentional plan for "track-back" scores that includes consideration of the following issues:
 - The impact of assigning scores to schools in priority status
 - The impact on the district if fewer accountable students attended A5 Schools
 - Future status and enrollment of A5 schools
- Develop a "common digital learning platform" across all high schools for credit recovery, Common Core/Quality Core mastery
- Consider an Alternative School STANDARDS AND PERFORMANCE BASED approach connected to Project Based Learning and Career/Technical Education this would include grading and graduation criteria
