AdvanceKentucky Update

History/Background:

Existing Policy. AdvanceKentucky began in the 2008-2009 academic year under a partnership with the National Math and Science Initiative and continues with support from the Kentucky Department of Education among other sponsors. This update will feature several parts as follows:

- The 2013 annual performance report, which includes a five-year performance review;
- The release of inaugural independent longitudinal research on the impact of the AP experience among AdvanceKentucky students;
- The sixth cohort of public high schools in the 2013-14 school year (the seventh cohort is under development including Race to the Top schools);
- The 2014-16 budget request that includes \$2M in support for continuing expansion to additional AdvanceKentucky cohorts; and
- The Partner Program among schools that have completed their original agreements.

AdvanceKentucky staff will be present at the April board meeting to give this update.

Impact on Getting to Proficiency:

Independent research has been conducted by the Kentucky Center for Education and Workforce Statistics. Its December 2013 report, "The Longitudinal Impact of the AP Experience among AdvanceKentucky Students, reported that AdvanceKentucky students performed better in high school, earned higher college GPAs, and required far less remediation in college (developmental education courses).
