Dr. Hargens: "We share with CLOUT the desire to see academic achievement improve in our District and that takes addressing behavior and takes reducing suspensions.

I have met with CLOUT 16 times since I arrived here and I have heard the concerns. CLOUT wants implementation of their plan. JCPS believes that Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), which includes examples or aspects of Restorative Practice and other initiatives combine to create a better environment for students and teachers.

CLOUT has presented one proposed solution to a multi-faceted issue and has attempted—as evidenced tonight—to force the District into utilizing one method. JCPS, in conjunction with leading experts in the field of discipline and proactive solutions to behavior problems, has implemented the research-based PBIS, which is showing results in schools.

PBIS includes aspects of Restorative Practice and the Code of Conduct committee has proposed inclusion of Restorative Practice using the expertise of local experts here in Louisville, Kentucky.

JCPS is addressing disproportionality through a focused system of both student and staff interventions in the form of PBIS and Student Response Teams and cultural responsiveness training.

What I need to do as superintendent is spend every ounce of my energy working with staff to do the actual work that will impact students. They deserve our staff's full attention."
