# Rationale

- Myers Middle school ranked in the 1<sup>st</sup> percentile in the state in 2013 (down from the 3<sup>rd</sup> percentile in 2012)
- 17% of all students at Myers were proficient or distinguished in Reading and Math combined in 2013
- The 2013 Leadership Assessment Report identified several deficiencies:
  - Of the 33 indicators reviewed, 12 were rated a “1” and 21 were rated a “2” on a 4 point performance scale
  - 72% of the improvement priorities were in the area of teaching and learning
  - Of the 6 deficiencies identified in the 2011 leadership assessment, 4 deficiencies were found to have little or no evidence of improvement

# Process

- Several meetings to discuss possible options for Myers Middle School were held with:
  - Students (focus groups and surveys)
  - Parents
  - Myers staff
  - Principals
  - Central Office
- Letters were sent to parents of current Myers students and incoming 6<sup>th</sup> grade students
- Letters were sent to Metro Council members and State legislators who serve Myers resides area

# Student Voice

- Current Myers students had mixed experiences this year. Positives focused on leadership, reward systems, and clubs/activities. Concerns focused on student behavior problems and lack of teacher consistency in discipline practices.
- Rising 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students reported about changes:

	Pros	Cons
Waggener	New start, better environment, role models	Concerns about bullying by HS students
Myers	Finish middle school at same school	Still needs changes, not a “real” middle school

- More incoming 6<sup>th</sup> students responded that they wanted to attend a different school (63%) than attend Myers (46%).

# Proposal

## 1. Incoming Sixth Graders

- The incoming sixth-grade students (N= 210) will be placed in one of ten middle schools (The Academy @ Shawnee, Carrithers, Highland, Meyzeek, Newburg, Noe, Ramsey, Thomas Jefferson, Western, and Westport).
- Shawnee and Western families would choose between the 2 schools
- Students will be paired with central office mentor

## 2. Rising 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders



- Finish their middle school experiences as Myers Middle school students at Waggener High
- Students will stay together and participate in middle school activities

## 3. Schools receiving students will be appropriately resourced.

# Proposal

4. Students participating in English as a Second Language (ESL) and Exceptional Child Education (ECE) programs will be placed in units based on programmatic needs, space, and transportation considerations.
5. All impacted families will be able to apply for a transfer to another school for their student(s).
6. The current Myers Middle School building will be repurposed to meet the needs identified in the long-range facilities plan such as early childhood, alternative education programs, and English language learner programs. A specific recommendation will be made in June 2014 as part of the final long-range facilities plan.
