LOCAL/STATE BOARD FACILITIES HEARING REPORT

AMENDMENT NO. 1

A Local/State public hearing was held at the Henderson County Board of Education on April 22nd, 2014, at 5:30P.M (CST). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Henderson County Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted unanimously (17-0) in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board vo1ed 4-1 to approve the new plan.

There were (0) zero individuals in attendance. Steve Steiner from the Henderson County School district, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer.

COMMENTS

Steve Steiner called the public hearing to order. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR4: 180. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Board of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed amendment to the District Facility Plan which includes; making Jefferson Elementary School, South Heights, and Spottsville Elementary School, Transitional Facilities under school center status. Priority One (1): Constructing two (2) new 700 student capacity elementary schools for Jefferson Elementary School and Spottsville Elementary Schools; Construct additional classroom additions for Auto Tech, Machine Tool, Welding, Carpentry, Marking Lab, and Engineering, and acquire property to allow egress to the site to offer additional space for district service at Henderson County High School. Priority Two (2): Remove Jefferson Elementary School, Spottsville Elementary School, and South Heights Elementary School renovations. Priority Three (3) and Four (4): No change. Priority Five (5): Remove Jefferson Elementary School and Spottsville Elementary School discretionary construction projects.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. No one requested to speak concerning the proposed District Facilities Plan for the Henderson County Schools.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Amended District Facilities Plan developed by the Henderson County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Henderson County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Henderson County School District. A copy of the amended plan is attached.

 - If "rejected" the Local Board submits a letter to the <u>Department</u> for review. The Local Board will then be asked to submit a letter to the LPC that gives specific direction as to the Board's concerns and intent. This will then be reviewed by the LPC and the plan will be adjusted and returned to the Board for their review to submit it back to the Department.
 - Currently, the Final Proposal is scheduled to be submitted to the State School Board in their <u>Henderson County</u> meeting.
 - Following the meeting the Local School Board will be notified of the State School Boards decision.
 - If the Facilities Plan is "rejected" by the State Board, the Local Board of Education must submit a modification of the Hearing Officer Report from the Kentucky Department of Education
 - When "accepted", the Local Board of Education submits the Final Proposal to the Kentucky Department of Education
 - This Final Proposal is resubmitted to the State School Board in their regular meetings.
 - Following the meeting the Local School board is notified of the State School Boards decision.
