Community Eligibility Provision

▶ Established by the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act

► Enables eligible high poverty districts and schools to offer Free Breakfast and Lunch to all students

Based on percent of students in each location certified to receive free meals


Community Eligibility Provision

Schools that are 62.5% certified may serve all students free breakfast and lunch

- Schools may also be clustered
 - Schools with a lower percent may be clustered with schools with a higher percent to arrive at 62.5%

Community Eligibility Provision-JCPS

- We have identified 95 schools where 100% of the breakfasts and lunches served would be free to students
- ► 65 locations had 62.5% or greater of enrolled students directly certified
- ▶ 30 additional schools were clustered with these schools
