

- CHHS JROTC cadets Hunter Harned, Joseph Higgs and Timothy Whitehouse participated in Boy's State in June 2013.
- KHSAA has changed the way regional courses are chosen for cross country – as a result, Central Hardin has been chosen to **host** next year for class A, AA, and AAA. This is a huge compliment to our course and our volunteers!

- CHHS senior **Heather Dean** was commissioned over the summer complete a series of specific artwork for the **Ocala Cannibal Roller Derby Team** in Florida! Heather completed and emailed the artwork about one month later. The artwork was published as a 30 page coloring book and is currently being sold at their games. Heather was then commissioned to design a new logo for the **Cannibal's Junior League Team** which is currently displayed on their helmets, shirts, etc.
- On August 17th, the top 100 singing acts competed at the state fair semi-finals. CHHS junior **Spencer Floyd** placed 1st in his session, receiving 15 out of 15 ranking points, and a cash prize of \$50. The Bruin A Team captured 1st place in the Boat Race and the Aid & Litter Relay while placing 2nd in the Tug-of-War. The Bruins dominated the Aid & Litter Relay as the B Team came in a close 2nd place. The other events were a physical fitness test, a one rope bridge, and a mystery event. Teams were unaware of their standings until announced at the closing ceremony. The Bruins placed 2nd last year at this competition.
- The CHHS JROTC Bruin Raider Teams travel to Louisville October 19th to compete in the Southern High School Raider Meet. 35 teams will compete in this year's meet. The Bruins have placed 1st and 3rd in the last two Southern Meets and plan to challenge for the overall championship once again!

- The Central Hardin Bruin JROTC Raider Teams placed 1st & 2nd overall at the Southern High School Raider Meet October 19th in Louisville. 43 Army, Marine, and Navy JROTC teams from 4 states competed in the challenging 16 event meet. A large crowd turned out in the cold and rain and witnessed the Bruins dominate the 43 team field. This is the first time in the competitions history that a single school has placed 1st and 2nd overall! The Bruins placed 1st in five events, 2nd in one, and 3rd in six.
- The CHHS Bruin Raider Teams have done well this season having won the Hardin County Raider Cup winning 4 of 5 events and placing 2nd overall at Eastern KY University with 39 teams winning 2 of 5 events! Their final competition this fall will be at Fort Knox High School November 2nd.
- The CHHS Bruin JROTC Color Guard was selected to present the National Colors at the 2013 National FFA Convention's Opening Assembly October 30th @ Freedom Hall in Louisville. The Color Guard consists of senior Angel Pagan; juniors James Grant, Mason Edlin and Justin Lowder; and sophomore Adam Buhlinger.
- The Central Hardin Bruin JROTC Raider Team placed 2nd overall at the Fort Knox Raider Meet November 2nd at Fort Knox. The meet featured 26 teams competing in the challenging 6 events. A large crowd turned out for the competition and witnessed outstanding teamwork and determination. The Bruins captured a 1st, 2nd (2), and a 3rd place finish in the events. This concludes the Bruin Raider season as they have done well by either winning or placing 2nd in the meets they have competed. The Bruins placed 1st and 2nd in two of the competitions.
- The CHHS Bruin JROTC Raider Team placed 1st and 2nd in the HUMVEE Push against 26 teams at the Fort Knox High School Raider Meet November 2nd. The team won 2nd place overall!

Game Play Win Loss Record: *The only time a CHHS team was beaten they were playing against CHHS Team* CHHS Team B 14 wins – 1 Loss; and CHHS Team A 12 wins – 3 losses.
- The 40 member **CHHS Bruin JROTC Drill Team** returned from the Alvin C. York Institute in Jamestown, TN, as the overall champions December 7th. Teams from Tennessee and Kentucky competed in the 6th annual 10 event competition. The USAR's 95th Division Drill Sergeants served as judges for the competition. The **Bruins** male and female teams combined to win 6 of 7 events! The **Bruins** also won two of the individual and dual events with junior **Ravein Price** winning the Knockout while the team of sophomores **Adam Buhlinger** and **Chase Williamson** taking first in dual exhibition. Senior **Joseph Higgs** placed first in the academic event and was selected as the **Drill Sergeant's Choice** as the top cadet in the competition.
- CHHS seniors **Cheyenne McClure** and **Katrina Timbers** were selected as **WBKO/WKU Honors College Scholar of the Week** during the fall semester. The students were recognized at a dinner at Western Kentucky University December 10th.
- CHHS Friends of Rachel Club hosted their annual "coin war" (between the grade levels) during the week of December 9th-13th. All donations are used to make the holiday season a little brighter for some of our CHHS students and a few future **Bruins**. Final totals: seniors, 31,044; freshman, 23,845; juniors, 19,988; and sophomores, 18,145. End result: over \$800 was raised which was used to buy clothing and items for our students in need!

The regional competition grants 8 qualification positions for the Kentucky State Vex Championship February 15th at The University of Louisville Speed School of Engineering. 58 Teams competed in the Regional contest, one of 4 regional contests across KY that will award qualification positions to the Kentucky State Vex Championship. CHHS Project Lead the Way (PLTW) pre-engineering program is preparing students for a global economy and competing at a world level. Students take the skills they learn in pre-engineering classes and go further by competing in the largest student robotics organization Vex Robotics Competitions. This is the 1st year CHHS has competed in the Kentucky Vex Robotics League that is part of a World League of 24 Countries and over 15,000 students involved! CHHS was represented by 4 Robotics Teams at the ECS KY Regional Event and were led by TSA Sponsor and PLTW teacher, Jason Neagle.
