- 8 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: <u>KRS 156.070, 156.160, 157.320,</u> 158.060
- 9 and 158.070 define[s] the school day and month and requires the board to promulgate
- administrative regulations governing the make-up of school days missed. KRS 158.070 defines
- the school term and requires the board to promulgate administrative regulations for [year-round
- sehool program calendars, governing the use of school days, and establishing school calendars.
- 13 This administrative regulation establishes the requirements for school districts to follow
- 14 regarding school calendars.
- 15 Section 1. Calendar requirements. (1) The local board of education , upon recommendation of
- the local school district superintendent, ] shall adopt a school calendar [for the upcoming school
- 17 year on or before May 15 of each year. The calendar shall:
- 18 (a) [Establish the opening and closing dates of the school term;
- 19 (b) Establish beginning and ending dates of each school month;
- 20 (c) State the number of days of instruction;
- 21 (d)] Establish the [minimum] length of each[the] student attendance [instructional] day;

- 1 (b) [(e)] Set [state] the instructional time the local board of education requires for kindergarten
- 2 per KRS 157.320 (7); [if in excess of the minimum three (3) hours of instruction
- 3 (f) State whether the additional instructional time, if any, is planned to be banked to make up for
- 4 full days which may be missed due to an emergency; and
- 5 (g) Designate days on which schools shall be dismissed.]
- 6 (2) Opening day [,for planning activities without the presence of pupils,] shall be scheduled to
- 7 occur prior to the first <u>student attendance</u> [<u>instructional</u>] day of the school <u>year</u> [<u>term</u>].
- 8 (3) Closing day [,for planning activities without the presence of pupils,] shall be scheduled to
- 9 occur following the completion of the last student attendance [instructional] day of the school
- 10 <u>year</u> [term].
- 11 (4) Local school districts shall plan appropriately for the make-up of instructional time missed
- due to emergency. In addition to the minimum 1,062 [1050] hour student instructional year
- 13 [term], the school calendar shall include days equal to the greatest number of days missed
- system-wide in the local school district over the preceding five (5) school years.
- 15 (5) Graduation ceremonies <u>may be held before the end</u> [shall be scheduled to occur following
- 16 <u>completion</u>] of the <u>student</u> instructional <u>year</u> [term]. <u>Diplomas shall be distributed after</u>
- 17 <u>completion of the student instructional year</u>.
- 18 (6) An up-to-date master (bell) schedule shall be on file in a school. Up-to-date master (bell)
- schedules for each school in a district shall be on file in the district's central office.
- 20 Section 2. Calendar approval. (1) The local board of education shall file each adopted school
- 21 calendar with the department [Department of Education] no later than June 30 of each year. The
- local school district shall not be paid any installment of its SEEK program allotment until the
- 23 school calendar has been approved by the department [Department of Education].

- 1 (2) The local board of education, upon recommendation of the local school district
- 2 superintendent, may amend the school calendar.
- 3 (3) An amended school calendar shall be submitted for approval to the <u>department</u> [Department
- 4 of Education | no later than June 30 of each year.
- 5 Section 3. Instructional time missed. (1) The regularly scheduled school day shall not be
- 6 shortened after the school calendar has been adopted by the local board of education and
- 7 approved by the department [Department of Education] except in cases of emergency declared
- 8 by the local school district superintendent in accordance with policies of the local board of
- 9 education.
- 10 (2) The local school district shall be allowed a total of five (5) instructional hours missed each
- school year that do not have to be made up, and that occurred as a result of school days shortened
- due to emergency. These hours shall be reported to the department and credited to the amended
- school calendar [on the amended school calendar].
- 14 (3) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, all <u>instructional</u> time missed on school
- days shortened due to emergency shall be made up and shall be reported to the <u>department</u>
- 16 [Department of Education] on the amended school calendar.
- 17 Section 4. Disaster days. (1) A school district shall not be considered for disaster days unless the
- district has missed more than twenty (20) regular student attendance [instructional] days system-
- 19 wide. The local school district shall make up at least the first twenty (20) regular student
- attendance [instructional] days missed in a school year by adding these equivalent hours back
- 21 into the school calendar.
- 22 (2) A local board of education request for district-wide disaster days shall be submitted to the
- 23 Commissioner of Education for approval. A copy of the local board order shall accompany this

- 1 request. Approved disaster days shall be the length of the student attendance day established in
- 2 <u>the approved calendar</u>.
- 3 Section 5. Emergency days. A local board of education may request emergency [disaster] days if
- 4 one (1) school, or part of the district, is forced to miss school on a particular day due to an
- 5 emergency. The request shall be submitted to the Commissioner of Education for approval. A
- 6 copy of the local board order shall accompany this request. Approved emergency days shall be
- 7 <u>the length of the student attendance day established in the approved calendar.</u>
- 8 Section 6. Activities of the school day. (1) The following shall constitute the activities to be
- 9 conducted during the instructional school day:
- 10 (a) Courses and content included in the "Kentucky Core Academic Standards" ["Program of
- 11 Studies for Kentucky Schools, Grades Primary-12"], pursuant to 704 KAR 3:303;
- 12 (b) [Courses and activities included in the local school district program of studies for which a
- 13 letter of assurance of compliance has been submitted to the Department of Education pursuant to
- 14 <del>704 KAR 3:305;</del>]
- 15 [(e)] Cocurricular activities which are unequivocally instructional in nature, directly related to
- the instructional program and scheduled to minimize absences from classroom instruction; and
- 17 (c) [<del>(d)</del>] A maximum of five (5) minutes passing time between instructional periods, and travel
- 18 time required to participate in regular instructional programs off of the school campus including
- 19 vocational schools, day treatment centers, and alternative schools. Travel time to off-campus
- 20 facilities shall be scheduled to minimize absence from classroom instruction.
- 21 (2) The local board of education shall adopt a policy specifying cocurricular instructional
- activities which may be included in the instructional school day, as described in subsection (1)
- 23 (b) [(c)] of this section.

- 1 (3) Each school shall have available a master (bell) schedule that delineates instructional time
- 2 periods and noninstructional time periods for all grade levels served and schedules provided. (36
