- 9 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 156.160(1)(g) requires the Kentucky
- 10 Board of Education to promulgate administrative regulations governing the sanitary and
- protective construction of public school buildings, toilets, physical equipment of school grounds,
- and classrooms. KRS 156.160(1)(h) [156.160(1)(g)] requires the Kentucky Board of Education
- to promulgate administrative regulations governing medical inspection, physical and health
- 14 education and recreation, and other administrative regulations deemed necessary or advisable for
- the protection of the physical welfare and safety of the public school children. KRS 156.160(1)(i)
- and (i) [156.160(1)(h) and (i)] require the board to promulgate an administrative regulation
- 17 governing a required vision examination and a dental screening or examination. This
- administrative regulation establishes [standards and] criteria for preventative student health care
- 19 examinations at the local school district level.

- 1 Section 1. School Employee Medical Examinations. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of
- 2 this section, a local board of education shall require a medical examination of each certified or
- 3 classified employee, including each substitute teacher. The medical examination shall:
- 4 (a) Be conducted prior to initial employment; and
- 5 (b) Include a tuberculosis (TB) risk assessment.
- 6 1. If the individual is identified by that assessment as being at high risk for TB, the individual
- 7 shall be required to undergo the administration of a tuberculin skin test (TST).
- 8 2. The TB risk assessment shall be performed and reported by a physician, an advanced practice
- 9 registered nurse, a physician's assistant, or a registered nurse.
- 10 (2) The medical examination requirement shall not apply to school bus drivers who are covered
- 11 by 702 KAR 5:080.
- 12 (3) A local board of education may require by policy that a school employee physical
- examination be conducted no earlier than a ninety (90) day period prior to initial employment.
- 14 (4) A medical examination shall be reported on the form Medical Examination of School
- Employees, KDESHS001 or an electronic medical record that includes all of the data equivalent
- to that on the Medical Examination of School Employees form.
- 17 (5) A person who tests positive for TB shall be required to comply with the directives of the local
- 18 board of health and the Kentucky Department for Public Health for further evaluation and
- 19 treatment of the TB infection.
- 20 (6)(a) Following the required medical examination for initial employment and any subsequent
- 21 examinations as may be required for positive tuberculin reactors, a school district employee other
- 22 than a bus driver shall submit to the local school superintendent the completed Medical
- 23 Examination of School Employees form [from] or an electronic medical record that includes all

- of the data equivalent to that on the Medical Examination of School Employees form required by
- 2 subsection (4) of this section.
- 3 (b) The medical examination shall be performed and signed for by a physician, physician's
- 4 assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse. Transmission of an electronic medical record
- 5 to the school district via email from the physician's office may be accepted as the official
- 6 <u>signature.</u>
- 7 (7) Documentation of a TST and chest x-ray, if performed, shall include:
- 8 (a) The date given;
- 9 (b) Type of test;
- 10 (c) Millimeters of induration;
- 11 (d) Date read and by whom; and
- 12 (e) Date x-ray taken and results as related to TB status.
- 13 (8)(a)1. A local board of education shall require all school personnel exhibiting symptoms of
- chronic respiratory disease to undergo a TB risk assessment and examinations as indicated.
- 15 2. The evaluation and any recommended treatment for TB infection shall be based upon the
- directives of the local board of health and the Kentucky Department for Public Health.
- 17 (b) An employee exposed to infectious TB shall be tested and, if necessary, treated for TB
- infection according to the directives of the local board of health.
- 19 (c) In a county with an incidence of cases of active TB that is equal to or greater than the national
- 20 average as established by the Department for Public Health, Division of Epidemiology and
- 21 Health Planning, Tuberculosis Prevention and Control Program, the local board of health may,
- 22 with the approval of the Kentucky Department for Public Health, require more extensive testing
- of school district employees for TB.

- 1 Section 2. Preventative Student Health Care Examinations. (1)(a) A local board of education
- 2 shall require a preventative health care examination for students within one (1) year prior to
- 3 <u>initial entry to school</u>.
- 4 (b) A second examination shall be required within one (1) year prior to entry into the sixth grade.
- 5 (c) A third examination may be required by policy of the local board of education within one (1)
- 6 year prior to entry into the ninth grade.
- 7 (2) An out-of-state transfer student shall be required to submit documentation of a preventative
- 8 health care examination.
- 9 (3) A local [school] board of education may extend the deadline by which to obtain a
- preventative <u>student</u> health care examination, not to exceed two (2) months.
- 11 (4) A preventative student health care examination shall be performed and signed for by a
- 12 physician, an advanced practice registered nurse, a physician's assistant, or by a health care
- provider in the early periodic screening diagnosis and treatment programs. <u>Transmission of an</u>
- 14 <u>electronic medical record to the school district via email from the physician's office may be</u>
- accepted as the official signature.
- 16 (5) A preventative student health care examination shall be reported on the Preventative Student
- Health Care Examination Form, KDESHS002, or an electronic medical record that includes all
- of the data equivalent to that on the Preventative Student Health Care Examination Form, and
- shall include:
- 20 (a) A medical history;
- 21 (b) An assessment of growth and development and general appearance;
- 22 (c) A physical assessment including hearing and vision screening; and

- 1 (d) Recommendations to the school regarding health problems that may require special attention
- 2 in classroom or physical education activities.
- 3 (6)(a) A vision examination shall be reported on the form, Kentucky Eye Examination Form for
- 4 School Entry, KDESHS004, or other electronic medical record that includes all of the data
- 5 equivalent to that on the Kentucky Eye Examination Form for School Entry.
- 6 (b) A dental screening or examination shall be reported on the form, Kentucky Dental
- 7 Screening/Examination Form for School Entry, KDESHS005, or other electronic medical record
- 8 that includes all of the data equivalent to that on the Kentucky Dental Screening/Examination
- 9 Form for School Entry.
- 10 (7) [A record of immunization shall be submitted on an Immunization Certificate, EPID-230.
- 11 (8) A local school district shall establish a plan for implementation and compliance required for
- the sixth grade preventative <u>student</u> health care examination.
- 13 (8) [(9)] A current Immunization Certificate, EPID-230, incorporated by reference into 902
- 14 KAR 2:060, or an electronic medical record that includes data equivalent to that on the
- 15 Immunization Certificate EPID-230, shall be on file within two (2) weeks of the child's
- 16 enrollment in school.
- 17 (9) [(10)] (a) A board of education shall adopt a program of continuous health supervision for all
- currently enrolled students [school enrollees].
- 19 (b) Supervision shall include scheduled, appropriate screening tests for vision and hearing.
- 20 (10) [(11)] A school shall have emergency care procedures, which shall include:
- 21 (a) First aid facilities, including provisions for designated areas for the child to recline;

- 1 (b) A requirement that whenever children are present during school hours or during school
- 2 <u>sponsored activities</u>, there shall be at least one (1) adult present in the school who is certified in a
- 3 standard first aid course which includes CPR for infants and children;
- 4 (c) A requirement that, at all times when students are present during school hours or school
- 5 sponsored activities, there is a school employee who is trained to administer or assist with the
- 6 <u>administration of glucagon, insulin or seizure rescue medications.</u>
- 7 (d) A number at which parents can be reached; and
- 8 (e) $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{(d)}}$ The name of a family physician.
- 9 [(12) A local board of education shall require immunizations as required by KRS 214.034.]
- Section 3. Cumulative Health Records. (1) A school shall initiate a cumulative health record for
- each <u>student</u> [pupil] entering its school.
- 12 (a) The record shall be maintained throughout the student's [pupil's] attendance.
- 13 (b) The record shall be uniform and shall be on the form <u>Student's</u> [Pupil's] Cumulative Health
- Record, KDESHS006, or the record shall be maintained electronically in the student information
- 15 system.
- 16 (c) The record shall include screening tests related to growth and development, vision, hearing,
- and dental, and findings and recommendations of a physician and a dentist.
- 18 (d) A follow-up by the proper health or school authorities shall be made on each abnormality
- 19 noted, and the result shall be recorded.
- 20 (2) A local school district [authority] shall report all known or suspected cases of communicable
- 21 disease immediately to the local health department.

- 1 Section 4. Physical Environment. (1) A board of education shall provide and maintain a physical
- 2 environment that is conducive to the health and safety of school children in each school under its
- 3 jurisdiction.
- 4 (2) A local board of education shall comply with current laws and administrative regulations
- 5 applicable to all public buildings pertinent to health, sanitation, and safety.
- 6 (3) A local board of education shall establish and maintain:
- 7 (a) An adequate supply of water of safe, potable, and sanitary quality;
- 8 (b) A state-approved sanitary disposal of sewage, other water carried waste, and solid waste;
- 9 (c) Adequate toilet and lavatory facilities, including soap or detergent as well as towels or other
- methods for drying hands, and other sanitary fixtures;
- 11 (d) Adequate heating, lighting, and ventilation in all school buildings;
- 12 (e) Adequate facilities and equipment for cafeterias and lunchrooms;
- 13 (f) A first aid room that meets the minimum specifications required by 702 KAR 4:170;
- 14 (g) Supervision of general sanitation and safety of the school buildings, grounds, and playground
- 15 equipment;
- 16 [(g) Beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, Proof that all unlicensed school personnel who
- 17 have accepted delegation to perform medication administration in school have completed a
- 18 training course provided by the Kentucky Department of Education. This course shall be
- 19 developed in consultation with the Kentucky Board of Nursing to ensure compliance with 201
- 20 KAR 20:400 and KRS 156.502;
- 21 (h) Adequate control of air pollutants; and
- 22 (i) Universal precautions guidelines compatible with Occupational Safety and Health
- Administration requirements established in 803 KAR 2:320 and 29 C.F.R. 1910.1030.

- 1 Section 5. School district health personnel. (1) A superintendent shall designate a person to
- 2 serve as school health coordinator for the district. [(1)] The person designated shall meet the
- 3 minimum qualifications required of this position as determined by the Education [Educational]
- 4 Professional Standards Board in 16 KAR 4:010, Section 12, or by the department [Kentucky
- 5 Department of Education in the Local District Classification Plan for Class Code: 7271, as
- 6 indicated in the document [Setting Up] Employee Classification Codes for Payroll.
- 7 (2) [Class Title: School Health Coordinator for the district.] The school health coordinator shall
- 8 work in cooperation with all school personnel, the local board of education, the <u>department</u>
- 9 [State Department of Education], the local health department, and family resource and youth
- services centers, [and parents] in [planning,] promoting[,] and implementing a school health
- 11 services program.
- 12 Section 6. Delegation to perform medication administration. (1) A local board of education shall
- shall require proof that all unlicensed school personnel who have accepted delegation to perform
- 14 medication administration in school have completed a training course provided by the
- department. This course shall be developed in consultation with the Kentucky Board of Nursing
- to ensure compliance with 201 KAR 20:400 and KRS 156.502;
