## Contract for Students Attending the Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky 2007-2008 School Year

The board of education of the <u>Hardin County</u> school district (district of legal residence of pupils) enters into a contract with Western Kentucky University (the Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky) to educate students of <u>Hardin County</u> school district who are attending the Academy.

# Performance Based Credit for Students Attending the Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky

In addition to Carnegie units, students may earn credit through a performance based credit system that complies with requirements of Kentucky Administrative Regulation, 704 KAR 3:303.

Students shall receive credit toward graduation requirements by successfully completing performance-based credits at the Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky.

## College Credit/Dual Credit

To differentiate/accelerate the curriculum to meet the needs of students, the District shall recognize course from the Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky. Students will receive one (1) high school credit for every three (3) semester hours of college work. Failure to complete the course shall be recorded according to school policy. Credit may be earned in accordance with the following requirements:

- The high school must receive an official record of the final grade before credit toward graduation will be recognized; and
- Students taking such courses must be enrolled in the District.

# **Academy/Sending School Attendance Guidelines**

### Sending School Responsibilities

In order for a school to receive the ADA funding and the CATS test scores, each school should do the following:

- Keep the student enrolled through STI or the present school attendance software;
- Count the student as present, beginning with the sending school's first day for students;
- Count the student present each day unless notified by the Academy via email;
- Create a class schedule based on the school's dual credit policy; and
- Report the student on the LEAD report as being taught by a "third party".

#### Academy Responsibilities

The Academy will do the following:

- Notify if students are unable to attend classes so that attendance records will be accurate;
- Send transcripts as soon as they are available after each semester; and
- Answer questions or concerns anytime
