REMARKS:

PROGRAMMATIC:

By November 30, 2014, you must submit to your Government Project Officer the following in writing:

PARTICIPANT PROTECTION:

Your written response regarding the participant protection concerns raised by the Initial Review Group (IRG). Your assigned Government Project Officer will provide you with the IRG review summary statement. All grant funds are available for this project except for those funds directly related to Participant Protection issues as outlined in the RFA. Currently, only activities that do not directly involve Participant Protection issues (i.e., are clearly severable and independent from those activities that do involve Participant Protection issues) may be conducted under this award. SPECIAL TERMS OF AWARD:

MULTI-YEAR:

This award reflects multi-year funding for a total of two 12 month incremental periods within a two year/24 month project period in the amount of \$100,000. The first 12 month period, the grantee organization may expend \$50,000.

Funding for each of the subsequent 12 month period(s) are restricted and the grantee organization may not expend more than \$50,000 during that time as follows:

9/30/2014 - 9/29/2015: \$50,000 9/30/2015 - 9/29/2016: \$50,000

FCR:

The Office of Financial Advisory Services (OFAS), SAMHSA is currently conducting a review of your organization's financial management system. If the review discloses material weaknesses or other financial management concerns, grant funding may be restricted in accordance with 45 CFR 74.14 or 45 CFR 92.12, as applicable. The restriction will affect the draw-down of funds from your organization's Payment Management Services account; subject to the review of (OFAS) and the approval of the applicable Grants Management Specialist and Government Project Officer.

DOMA:

On June 26, 2013, in United States v. Windsor, the Supreme Court held that section 3 of the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which prohibited federal recognition of same-sex spouses/marriages, was unconstitutional. As a result of that decision, SAMHSA is no longer prohibited from recognizing same-sex marriages. Consistent with HHS policy and the purposes of SAMHSA programs, same-sex spouses/marriages are to be recognized in the "Now is the Time" **Project AWARE Local Educational Agency grant program (NITT-AWARE-LEA).** This means that, as a recipient of SAMHSA funding for **NITT-AWARE-LEA**, you are required to treat as valid the marriages of same-sex couples whose marriage is legal when entered into. This applies regardless of whether the couple now lives in a jurisdiction that recognizes same-sex marriage or a jurisdiction that does not recognize same-sex marriage. Any same-sex marriage legally entered into in one of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, a U.S. territory or a foreign country will be recognized. However this does not apply to registered domestic partnerships, civil unions, or similar formal relationships recognized under state law as something other than a marriage.
