### **CURRENT ARTS EDUCATION RESEARCH**

- ✓A student involved in the arts is four times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement.
- Students with HIGH arts participation and low socio-economic status have a 4% dropout rate – 5x lower than their low socio-economic status peers.
- ✓ Students who take four years of arts and music classes during high school average almost 100 points better on their SAT scores than students who take only one-half year or less.
- Low-income students who are highly engaged in the arts are twice as likely to graduate college as their peers with no arts education.
- ✓72% of business leaders say that creativity is the number one skill they are seeking when hiring.
- ✓93% of Americans believe that the arts are vital to providing a well rounded education.



#### PARTICIPATION IN THE ARTS 2013-14 ARTS COURSES


- High School 169 arts courses with 13,029 students enrolled
