KDE Program Review Process - Summary

School Level

- Step 1: Create Review Committee(s)
- Step 2: Identify/Update Evidence
- Step 3: Rubric Assessment/re-evaluation
- Step 4: Identify Next Steps
- Step 5: Report on Program Status (to SBDM)

District Level

- Step 1: Schools monitored twice during the year with progress updates
- Step 2: Administrator Peer Review of Program Review Reports
- Step 3: District Second Read and Approval of Program Review Reports

Accountability

Program Reviews count for 23% of school accountability (20% beginning in 2015-2016)

Schools may meet their Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) through increases in Program Review and/or Next Generation Learners. For example a school that moves from 15 points to 16 points in a year in Program Review receives one point toward meeting their AMO (which is one point). This school would be classified as Needs Improvement, but would be showing progress.

Program Review Purpose

- To provide for careful and systematic analysis of current programs and help identify the next steps that will make the most impact on student learning.
- To inform the schools' programs in order to **establish** a process of **on-going discussion**, **reflection** and **growth**.
- To provide a basis for developing a plan for improvement which may become a component in the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan.

Program Review Goals

- To improve the quality of teaching and learning for all students in all programs
- To allow equal access to all students in the skills that will assist them in being productive citizens
- To allow students to demonstrate their understanding beyond a paper-and-pencil test
- To ensure a school wide <u>natural integration</u> of the program skills across all contents, beyond the program areas
