- ❖ Teachers have input all of their Student Growth Goal information into the CIITS program. Teachers will continue to assess student growth based on their submitted rubrics and will meet with the school administration during the mid-year review meetings. - ❖ The school administration in collaboration with the SBDMC has decided to purchase additional intervention programs within the WonderWorks Reading Series. LES now has the intervention programs for grades K-3 and plans to implement the reading kits with the appropriate ability-based groups.

Students will receive MAP ribbons for hitting certain RIT score numbers for reading, math, and language usage at the recognition assembly on 1/16.
- ❖ The LES Clubs have been meeting on a weekly basis in preparation for upcoming events. The chess club participated in a friendly match at Highlands Middle School on 12/5. The student council planned the themed schools days up until 12/19. The art club and chorus continue to meet to work on their talents. The speech and drama club has been preparing for the school play to occur in the spring of 2015.
