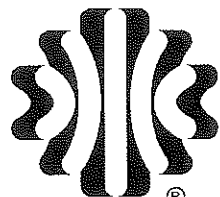

Organizations wishing to apply for a grant through the E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Foundation must provide the following information:

- mc* • A letter of request with an overview of the organization, project, and amount of the grant request.
- mc* • A history of the organization requesting funds which shows community support and involvement.
- mc* • A complete breakdown of amount requested with supporting documentation, such as; quotes and/or bids for the requested project, cost of construction, equipment, supplies, etc...
- Ramen* • An IRS tax exemption letter or certificate referencing status as 501(c)(3).
- sub* • The articles of incorporation for the organization, or by-laws, specifying non-profit status.
- sub* • A list of board members and their addresses.
- Ramen* • Financial statements for the organization.

This information should be submitted no later than January 1st for the spring meeting and no later than July 1st for the autumn meeting of the Foundation Board.

TCCHS BOYS' BASEBALL BOOSTER CLUB
BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the organization shall be the TCCHS Boys' Baseball Booster Club, hereafter referred to as the Boosters.

ARTICLE II: OBJECTIVE

The primary objective of the organization shall be to support the Todd County Central High School Boys' Baseball team. Activities contributing to this objective shall be to:

1. Promote the boys' baseball team at Todd County Central High School.
2. Cooperate with the coach, administration, faculty, staff, and students of Todd County Central High School to promote and support the boys' baseball team and related activities.
3. Foster school spirit among coaches, students, faculty, staff, administration, parents, and community at large.
4. Raise money through various activities as deemed appropriate by the Boosters to support the objectives of the organization.
5. Adhere to the rules of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association.

ARTICLE III: SPECIFICATIONS

- 1) This organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 2) No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 3) Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or

corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

- 1) Any person interested in supporting the objectives of the Boosters shall be eligible for membership upon payment of the \$10.00 dues, per family per annum and shall be paid annually. Family shall include both husband and wife. Membership in the Boosters shall be open to persons 18 years or older, parents or guardians of students at TCCHS, alumni of TCCHS, and members of the community who desire to support the boys' baseball team at TCCHS.
- 2) At all general meetings of the Boosters, each member of the club who is present and has paid the annual dues for the current fiscal year shall have one vote. No member of the Boosters may vote by proxy or absentee ballot.

ARTICLE V: OFFICERS

The officers of the Booster Club shall consist of the following: a) president, b) vice-president, and c) secretary/treasurer. The officers shall be elected during the last general meeting of the Boosters fiscal year. Nominations shall be made from the floor and selection based upon majority vote of eligible voting members in attendance. Each officer shall serve a one-year term and is eligible for re-election each year. In the event a vacancy occurs in any office, the remaining officers shall elect a member of the Boosters to fill the vacancy.

Duties of the **president** shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1) Attend and preside at all general meetings of the Boosters.
- 2) Assist and oversee all fund raising activities.
- 3) Effect compliance with rules, regulations, and policies of Todd County Board of Education, the administration of TCCHS, and the KHSAA.
- 4) Assure that the objectives of the Boosters are being served.
- 5) Serve as an authorized agent for approving booster expenditures as specified in Article VI.

Duties of the **vice-president** shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1) Serve as president in the event of the temporary absence or disability of the president.
- 2) Perform such duties as may be delegated to him/her by the president.
- 3) Serve as president upon resignation of acting president.
- 4) Serve as an authorized agent for approving booster expenditures as specified in Article VI.

Duties of **secretary/treasurer** shall include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1) Attend and keep the minutes of the general meeting of the Boosters.
- 2) Keep the financial records of the Boosters, in accordance with accepted organization financial policies.
- 3) Collect dues from the members and handle all fundraising proceeds in accordance with accepted organization financial policies.
- 4) Render a short financial report at each general meeting.
- 5) Provide annual financial and other reports as required by the administration of Todd Central High School.
- 6) Serve as an authorized agent for approving booster expenditures as specified in Article VI.

ARTICLE VI: MEETINGS

1) Meetings shall be called as often as needed to accomplish the objectives of the organization. The president may call general meetings at his/her discretion or as needed.

2) The president shall schedule general meetings at a reasonable time and place and shall publicize each meeting as widely as is reasonably possible among the members and the community.

3) All matters, which are presented to the Boosters for action at a general meeting, shall be decided by majority vote of the members who are present at such meeting.

ARTICLE VII: FINANCIAL PROCEDURES

1) The organization shall maintain a checking account at a local bank to be chosen by the Boosters at a general meeting.

- 2) The organization shall maintain a post office box which will serve as the official address of the Boosters.
- 3) All checks for expenses of the organization shall require any two signatures of those approved as authorized agents. The authorized agents shall be the three elected officers and the head baseball coach.
- 4) The head baseball coach may encumber expenses for the benefit of the baseball program up to \$500. Any encumbrance greater than \$500 from the Boosters must be approved by the president, another officer, and the head baseball coach.
- 5) Any expenditures of \$2500 or greater must be approved by majority vote at a general meeting.
- 6) The fiscal year for the Booster Club shall begin on June 16 and end on June 15 of the following year.
- 7) An annual financial report shall be prepared by the secretary/treasurer, in conjunction with the head baseball coach, and submitted to the TCCHS administration by June 30. The financial report shall be made available to members at the next meeting after June 30, or upon request after that date.

ARTICLE VIII: PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

Booster meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the latest edition of Robert's Manual of Parliamentary Rules.

ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws of the organization may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the Boosters who are present at a general meeting.

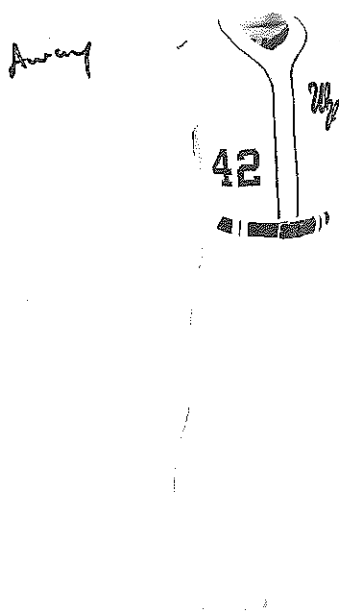
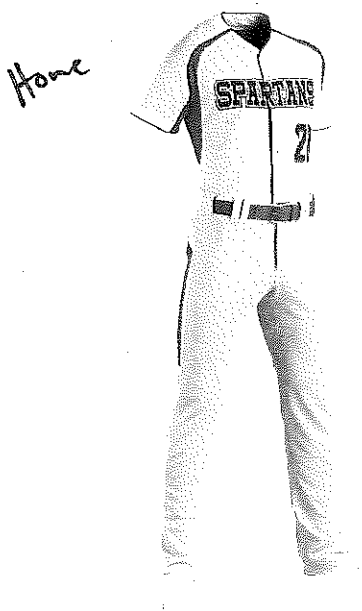
