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STANDARD PROVISIONS OF AGREEMENT

The CLIENT and CONSULTANT agree that the following provisions shall be a part of their agreement:

- 1. The CLIENT binds himself, his partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns to the CONSULTANT to this agreement in respect to all of the terms and conditions of this agreement.
- 2. Neither the CLIENT nor the CONSULTANT shall assign his interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.
- No conditions or representation, altering, detracting from, nor adding to the terms hereof shall be valid unless printed or written hereon or evidenced in writing by either party to this agreement and accepted in writing by the other.
- 4. In the event any provision of this agreement shall be held to be invalid and unenforceable, the other provisions of this agreement shall be valid and binding on the parties hereto.
- 5. The CONSULTANT is not responsible for delay, nor shall CONSULTANT be responsible for damages or be in default or deemed to be in default by reason of strikes, lockouts, accidents, or acts of God; or the failure of CLIENT to furnish timely information or to approve or disapprove CONSULTANT's work promptly; or delay or faulty performance by CLIENT, other contractors, or governmental agencies or any other delays beyond CONSULTANT's reasonable control.
- 6. CONSULTANT shall not be liable for damages resulting from the actions or inactions of governmental agencies including, but not limited to permit processing, environmental impact reports, dedications, general plans and amendments thereto, zoning matters, annexations or consolidations, use or conditional use permits, and building permits and building permits, and CONSULTANT shall only act as an advisor in all governmental relations.
- 7. In the event that CLIENT institutes a suit against CONSULTANT because of any failure alleged failure to perform, error omission, or negligence, and if such suit is not successfully prosecuted, or if it is dismissed, or if verdict rendered for CONSULTANT; CLIENT agrees to pay CONSULTANT any and all costs of defense, including attorney's fees, expert witnesses' fees and court costs and any and all other expenses of defense which may be needful immediately following dismissal of the case or immediately upon judgment being rendered in behalf of CONSULTANT.
- 8. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any term or provision of this agreement, or to collect any portion of the amount payable under this agreement, then all litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, and court costs, and attorney fees shall be paid to the prevailing party.
- 9. There are no understandings or agreements except as herein expressly stated.
- 10. Services provided within this agreement are for the exclusive use of the CLIENT for the PROJECT only
- 11. CLIENT and CONSULTANT agree to cooperate with each other in any and every way or manner on the PROJECT.
- 12. Upon written request, each of the parties hereto shall execute and deliver, or cause to be executed and delivered, such additional instruments and documents, which may be necessary and proper to carry out the terms of this agreement.
- 13. The terms and provisions of this agreement shall not be construed to alter, waive, or affect any lien or stop notice rights, which the CONSULTANT may have for the performance of services under this agreement.
- 14. The CONSULTANT makes no representation concerning the estimated quantities and cost figures made in connection with maps, plans, specifications, or drawings other than that all such figures are estimates only and the CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for fluctuations in cost factors.
- 15. CONSULTANT does not guarantee the completion or quality of performance of contract or the completion or quality of performance of contractor or contractors, or other third parties, nor is he responsible for their acts or omissions.
- 16. CONSULTANT make no warranty, either expressed or implied, as to his findings, recommendations, specifications, or professional advice except that the work was performed pursuant to generally accepted standards of practice in effect at the time of performance.
- 17. CONSULTANT make no representation concerning soil conditions unless specifically included in writing in the agreement, and he is not responsible for any liability that may rise out of the making or failure to make soil surveys or sub-surface soil tests or general soil testing.
- 18. In the event that any changes are made in the plans and specifications by the CLIENT or persons other that the CONSULTANT, which affects the CONSULTANT's work, any and all liability arising out of such changes is waived against the CONSULTANT and the CLIENT assumes full responsibility for such changes.
- 19. The CONSULTANT is not responsible, and liability is waived by CLIENT as against CONSULTANT, for use by CLIENT or any other person of any plans or drawings not signed by CONSULTANT.
- 20. CONSULTANT has a right to complete all services agreed to be rendered pursuant to this contract. In the event this agreement is terminated before the completion of all services, unless CONSULTANT is responsible for such early termination, CLIENT agrees to release CONSULTANT form all liability for work performed.
- 21. The CLIENT agrees to limit the CONSULTANT's liability to the CLIENT and to all contractors and subcontractors on the PROJECT due to the professional errors or omissions of the CONSULTANT to the sum of \$100,000 or the CONSULTANT's fee, whichever is greater.
- 22. All fees and other charges will be billed monthly and shall be due at the time of billing unless otherwise specified in this agreement.
- 23. CLIENT hereby agrees that the balance as stated on the billing from the CONSULTANT to CLIENT is correct, conclusive and binding on the CLIENT unless CLIENT within thirty (30) days from the date of the making of the billing notifies CONSULTANT in writing of the particular item that is alleged to be incorrect.
- 24. A late payment FINANCE CHARGE will be computed at the periodic rate of 1 ½ % per month, which is an ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE OF 18%, and will be applied to any unpaid balance commencing 30 days after the date of the original invoice.
- 25. In the event that the plans, specifications, and/or field work covered by this contract are those required by various governmental agencies and in the event that due to change of policy of said agencies after the date of this agreement, additional office or field work is required, the said additional work shall be paid for by the CLIENT as extra work.
- 26. In the event that any staking is destroyed by an act of God or parties other than the CONSULTANT, the cost of restaking shall be paid for by the CLIENT as extra
- 27. The CLIENT shall pay the costs of checking and inspection fees, zoning and annexation application fees, assessment fees, soil engineering fees, soil testing fees, aerial topography fees, and all other fees, permits, bond premiums, title company charges, blueprints and reproductions, and all other charges not specifically covered by the terms of this agreement.
- 28. In the event all or any portion of the work prepared or partially prepared by the CONSULTANT be suspended, abandoned, or terminated, the CLIENT shall pay the CONSULTANT for all fees, charges, and services provided for the PROJECT not to exceed any contract limit specified herein.
- 29. In the event CLIENT fails to pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days after invoices are rendered, CLIENT agrees that CONSULTANT shall have the right to consider said default a total breech of this agreement and upon written notice, the duties, obligations and responsibilities of the CONSULTANT under this agreement are terminated. In such event, CLIENT shall then promptly pay the CONSULTANT for all of the fees, charges, and services provided by the CONSULTANT.
- 30. Claims, disputes or other matters in question between the parties this agreement arising out of or relating to this agreement or breech thereof shall be subject to and decide by arbitration in accordance with Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of American Arbitration Association currently in effect unless the parties mutually agree otherwise.
- 31. Demand for Arbitration shall be filed in writing with the other party to this agreement and with the American Arbitration Association. A demand shall be made within a reasonable time after the claim; dispute or other matter in question has arisen.
- 32. Reimbursable items to the PROJECT shall be as follows and will be in addition to any other compensation agreed to between CLIENT and CONSULTANT: Mileage \$0.45 / mile; Lodging and Meals at direct cost; special shipping or mailing services including but not limited to overnight shipping shall be direct cost plus 10%.

Scope of Services Henderson County High School Concept 2A Implementation Design Henderson, KY Henderson County Schools

Item 1: Civil Plans/City Coordination/Survey/KYTC Permits.....\$29,250.00 (Lump Sum)

KYTC Encroachment Permit Application

• AEI will gather and compile the information necessary for the adequate completion of a KYTC encroachment permit for the work that will be done within KYTC Right of Way along KY351 (Zion Rd / 2nd Street). The application will require the development of an estimate and justification for the work to take place within KYTC Right-of-Way, as well as completing the necessary permit application paperwork. The work associated with this application does NOT include any surveying needed for sight distance verification. However, AEI does not anticipate KYTC requiring this survey information for sight distance verification. AEI can obtain any additional survey information on an hourly basis, if required per KYTC's permit review process.

Garden Mile Road -Intersection Coordination with the City of Henderson

• Per initial conversations with the City of Henderson, AEI / Henderson County Schools will need to coordinate closely with the City as it relates to the intersection improvements needed at the intersection of Garden Mile Road and HCHS's western entrance/exit (current student parking lot entrance/exit). The city is not willing to commit to participation or a preferred intersection improvement scheme without coordination, cost estimations, benefit/risk analysis, etc. Therefore, AEI will provide reasonable coordination efforts to assist the Henderson County Schools and the City of Henderson to reach an agreement regarding the Garden Mile Road / West Entry Intersection improvements associated with Concept 2A implementation. The coordination provided by AEI shall only include conceptual intersection layouts (maximum of 3), preliminary cost estimates for the conceptual layouts (1 iteration), coordination meetings with the school and city (includes 3 meetings). The intersection coordination EXCLUDES intersection design services needed for construction (The design services for the intersection improvements will need to be negotiated after the City and Henderson County Schools reach an agreement on the preferred intersection improvements to be implemented).

Topographic Survey

• AEI will provide topographic survey around the Henderson County High School Campus that is relevant to the design components identified in Concept 2A of the 2014 AEI conceptual traffic study. The survey data is required for accurate geometric and grade/drain design of the project. The survey work shall include the area around the Garden Mile Road proposed intersection improvements, as this information will be necessary for conceptual intersection improvement alternatives to be presented to City officials for cost sharing participation.



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Pavement Cores

• AEI intends to provide travel to/from site, perform 3 pavement cores (locations to be determined by civil designer based on final bus/heavy duty path determination), two page letter/report summarizing pavement core results. In addition to the pavement cores, AEI will provide a hand auger and dynamic cone penetrometer reading and minimal lab testing to evaluate stone thickness and subgrade strength at a pavement core location. This information will be useful for light duty and heavy duty pavement design/specifications, and is proposed to be done in lieu of future geotechnical drilling investigations.

Civil Plans

- AEI intends to provide preliminary site concepts (layout/grading), site design, and construction plans to comply with the City of Henderson / Henderson County Development Plan approval requirements. We are scoping on a *Final Development and Construction Plan* level for the Henderson County High School Concept 2A Implementation Design (Excluding Garden Mile Road Intersection improvements). Scope items include the following:
 - 1. Conceptual Layouts/Pavement Sections
 - 2. Demolition Plan
 - 3. Layout Plan.
 - 4. Grade and Drain Plan
 - 5. Erosion Control Plan.
 - 6. Site Utility Plan (excluding exterior lighting)
 - 7. Development Plan with Utility approval/signatures (if required)
 - 8. Associated Construction Details
 - 9. Site related specifications.
 - 10. Development of Engineer's Estimate for Civil Site Work
 - 11. Three (3) Project Team Progress meetings.

<u>Item 2: Construction Administration</u>......\$5,000.00 (Hourly Rates – Not to Exceed)

AEI intends to provide construction administration services for this project on an hourly rate basis, but not to exceed the stipulated amount above without prior architect/owner approval. Includes reasonable bidding assistance and post-bid administrative services.

AEI will NOT be providing the following as part of this agreement:

- 1. Any work/design related to the intersection improvements at Garden Mile Road and the Western HCHS entrance/exit (student parking lot). The final development and construction plan design services for this intersection will need to be negotiated at a later date. AEI is only scoping coordination with the City of Henderson to reach an agreement on the mutually preferred alternative for the intersection.
- 2. Traffic Signal, intersection, or signalization design
- 3. Exterior Lighting Design
- 4. Environmental (Phase I ESA, etc.)
- 5. Any Traffic Impact Studies
- 6. Additional Topo or Boundary Survey activities beyond what is described in the scope above.
- 7. Special Inspections and/or Material Testing (will need to be negotiated at a later date).

AEI can perform any of these services at a separate fee, if requested.
