Jefferson County Public Schools

- 27th largest school district in U.S.
- 100,855 students (slight increased over last 5 years)
 - 1/7 of all students in KY
 - 37% African American (½ of all African-American students in KY)
 - 49% White
 - 14% Other
- 155 Schools
 - Preschool
 - K-5 (Elementary)
 - 6-8 (Middle)
 - 9-12 (High)
 - Special Education
 - Alternative/Other



District Demographics 2013-14

Minority

• 51.5% of our students are minority (2013-14)

Free/Reduced Lunch

• 64% of our students receive free/reduced lunch (2013-14)

ESL

- 4.8% of JCPS students participated in the English as a Second Language program in 2013-14
- 109 different languages spoken


Special Needs

 Approximately 12,474 JCPS students, ages 3-21 years, received ECE (Exceptional Child Education) services in 2013-14


Homeless

JCPS Enrollment Trend and Five Year Projections




JCPS Market Share Trend Data



In 1990, market share was 75.7%


Race Trend Data




Free and Reduced Price Lunch Trend Data




English as Second Language (ESL) Trend Data





ESL and LEP Trend Data: Number of Students

































Louisville/Jefferson County

2000 - 2010





Percent change in population by race and Hispanic origin 2000 - 2010




From 2000 to 2010, Jefferson County population grew by 47,492.

- 57% of state Black population growth
- 35% of state Asian population growth
- 28% of state Hispanic population growth


Louisville/Jefferson County Percent Distribution by Race and Hispanic Origin




Total Population Growth 2000 - 2010




Percent Change in Total Population 2000 - 2010




Black Population Growth 2000 - 2010





Percent Change in Black Population 2000 - 2010




Louisville/Jefferson County Median Family Income












Louisville/Jefferson County Percent of Population in Poverty



The Census Bureau uses a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is in poverty. The poverty threshold for a family of four in 2000 was \$17,603 and \$21,954 in 2009.

Changes in demographics reflect changes in larger Jefferson County census data trends



JCPS Diversity Categories

Each block group is defined as a 1, 2 or 3

	Category 1	Category 2	Category 3
Income	Less than \$42,000	\$42,000-\$62,000	More than \$62,000
% white	Less than 73 %	73-88%	More than 88%
Educational Attainment (6 point scale)	Up to an Associate's degree (Less than 3.5)	College courses beyond an Associate's degree (3.5-3.7)	College courses up to a bachelor's degree and beyond (More than 3.7)
