The registration fee is \$50 per person, and board members can receive Level III Academy of Studies credit for participating. KSBA has set up a room block at the Capital Plaza Hotel, 405 Wilkinson Boulevard (502-227-5100), at a rate of \$83 per night.

Legislators are certain to value the presence of hundreds of school leaders lobbying for public education.
