

Lincoln Elementary School Board Report for January 28, 2015 "Home of the Little Devils"

- Literacy continues to be a point of emphasis at LES. Our students have currently read a total of 5947 AR books compared to 3898 at this time last year. We also had approximately 110 students in grades K-6 participate in our inaugural "Winter Break Reading Blitz Challenge." There were also 187 students who met their AR goal for the 2nd quarter of school. The plan is to also have a "Spring Break Reading Blitz Challenge."
- ❖ LES currently has 47 students in grades 1-3 participating in the One to One Reading program. The mid-year data shows that 87% (41/47) of the students working with a reading mentor improved their MAP scores for reading from the fall to the winter. As far as fluency is concerned, 100% of the students increased their words per minute with many students doubling the total amount of words read.
- ❖ The winter MAP data for students in grades K-6 looks promising in the subject areas of reading and math. We are currently at 47% of our students being at or above grade level in reading compared to 41% from last year while 47% of our students are at or above grade level in math compared to 43% from last year.
- ❖ LES has seven teachers along with teachers from Bellevue, Silver Grove, and Ludlow participating in the Next Generation STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Classroom Project during the 2014-15 school year. The remaining sessions are 2/11, 3/3 (middle school only), and 4/8.
- The final draft of the CSIP for LES was submitted in ASSIST on 1/2. The keys areas are as follows: Reading Proficiency, Math Proficiency, Writing Proficiency, Program Reviews, Parent/Community Involvement, and Best Instructional Practices.
- ❖ Teachers have input all of their Student Growth Goal information into the CIITS program and have been analyzing student performance data. The school administration will be conducting mid-year review meetings with teachers to discuss student progress and PGP progress.



- ❖ The newly implemented ESS program for students in grades 3-6 has been going very well thus far. Students will continue to attend tutoring on a weekly basis to receive the appropriate instructional interventions. The counselors have also met with all students who failed a class for the 2nd quarter of school to develop "Contracts to Pass."
- ❖ The second round of Advisory Team Meetings (ATM's) were held on 1/21-23. The basis of these meetings is to look at students who are receiving appropriate interventions and develop next steps in promoting student growth.
- ❖ The next round of K-PREP Scrimmage Testing will take place on 1/27-29. Students will be answering multiple choice, short answer, and extended response questions that mimic those to be on the actual K-PREP Tests in May. Teachers will be utilizing Gradecam to analyze data and develop next steps to address student misconceptions.
- ❖ "Students of the Month" (grades 4-6) for December and January will be treated to pizza
 with the principals on 2/20 for their good behavior, attendance, and grades. "Stars of
 the Month" (grades K-3) for December and January will enjoy pancakes with the
 principals on 2/24 for staying on green, attending school, and working hard in the
 classroom.
